RE: ADDENDUM FOR STUDENTS WHO ARE DEAF OR HARD OF HEARING

COMMUNICATION CONSIDERATIONS

The Public Education Department's (PED's) Special Education Bureau (SEB) developed the attached addendum to assist school districts in meeting the communication needs for students who are deaf or hard of hearing. The Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) requires IEP teams to consider the communication needs of a student when developing, reviewing, and revising a student's IEP. The IDEA states that in developing each student's IEP, the IEP team shall consider the communication needs of the student. In the case of a child who is deaf or hard of hearing the IEP team must consider the following:

- the child's language and communication needs,
- providing opportunities for direct communication with peers and professional personnel in the child's language and communication mode,
- the child's academic level, and
- the full range of needs, including opportunities for direct instruction in the child's language and communication mode (34 CFR 300.324 (a) (2) (iv)).
