2018 NOTICE OF INTENT TO SUBMIT CHARTER APPLICATION

INSTRUCTIONS

According to NMSA § 22-8B-6(B) the Notice of Intent to Submit a Charter Application ("NOI") must be filed by the organizers of a proposed charter school to the Public Education Commission at the address below <u>AND</u> to the superintendent of the school district in which the charter school is proposed to be located. *Failure to notify may result in your application being rejected*.

The NOI must be submitted by 5:00 PM Mountain Time on January 9, 2018, **the second Tuesday of January**. Notices of Intent that are not received by the Public Education Commission and the superintendent of the local school district by the deadline may result in the application being rejected. When you send the NOI to the superintendent of the school district in which your charter is to be located, you are strongly encouraged to send it by certified mail return receipt requested, or request a signed receipt when you deliver the NOI. Contact the local district regarding electronic filing.

Paul Lockhart	Founder	Paul is a lifelong New Mexican who has been in
		education sixteen years. One year at the high school level, six years teaching seventh grade math, three years as a middle school assistant principal and six years as Director of Research, Assessment, Data, and Accountability (RADA) at Rio Rancho Public Schools District Office. His experiences in education have provided him the ability to attain the necessary skills in the areas of curriculum, assessment, and educational leadership, culminating in the opportunity to carry out the vision of Endless Sky Charter School for Boys. His licensure includes a Level 3A secondary teaching license and a Level 3B educational leadership license. He holds a Bachelors of Business Administration in Marketing and a Masters of Arts in Educational Leadership. As the Director of RADA, he focuses on understanding and supporting, implementation of state requirements for graduation. This includes primary pathways as well as alternative or secondary pathways as well as alternative or secondary pathways. His extensive understanding of these requirements has allowed him to support district/school administration, teachers, students, and parents in understanding the expectations for gaining a diploma.
		During the fifteen years he has been with Rio Rancho Public Schools, he established strong relationships with district, school, and community leaders. These relationships have helped him with communication and implementation of his duties as District Testing Coordinator. As the requirements have increased at the federal and state level, the ability to condense and disseminate information has helped to relieve some of the burden on school administration. Additionally, the position as Director of RADA has given him the opportunity to communicate with departments at the state level and other school districts around New Mexico.

Montessori, IB): Endless Sky Charter School for Boys will provide a comprehensive educational program for male students who have not achieved the skills to keep up at grade level in a traditional school and classroom settings. These students are at risk to fall further behind with each passing school year and the parents want a setting where they are evaluated and a plan is put in place to provide them the skills to comprehend and flourish at their grade level. The driving force will be the identification of students who have not met learning outcomes, then Endless Sky will provide evidence-based interventions, adjust the intensity and nature of those interventions, depending on a student's responsiveness, and monitor their progress. This will be an educational setting where students are given the opportunity to fill gaps in their learning, prior to entering high school, and thus giving them opportunity to truly succeed in high school and make college a reality. The goal is to give students strong foundational skills and strategies for using their knowledge in new and increasingly complex situations. Ultimately achieving the ability to score at proficient levels or higher on standardized tests. Students will be provided four core teachers in the areas of Math, ELA, Science, Social Studies. The core teachers will integrate AVID strategies during a 5th period. The school will hold a four-day school week, 7 ½ hours per day. The teachers will work on Fridays and focus on Professional Learning Communities and weekly communication with the parents which will include sharing student work and updates on classroom learning and student progress. Following the same process as the medical field, students' needs will be evaluated and full disclosure with the families about the gaps and the course of action for filling the gaps will be provided. The founder believes that every students deserves quality intervention so that they have the skills to fully absorb what is being taught in the standards. This approach will provide students with the necessary skills to succeed in high school and beyond. Parents will be provided with an environment that instills confidence in their child's learning through consistent and in-depth communication. 4. At Endless Sky Charter School for Boys students will be provided with both rigorous standards based teaching along with individualized intervention. Students will be given the opportunity to develop skills, not only meet expectations, but to excel at grade level. Students will then realize their academic capabilities and therefore have the confidence and ability to succeed in high school and on to the college of their choosing.

Endless Sky will be located in the town of Bernalillo, NM. We will serve 5-8 grade male students from Bernalillo, Placitas, and the surrounding areas.

 Describe the student population including key demographic data (academic performance, home languages, English Learners (ELs), and special education populations) in the location in which the school intends to locate.

In the Bernalillo school district close to 50 % of students are Hispanic and over 40 % are Native American. 28% are English Language Learners and 16 % are identified as Students with Disabilities.

• Identify where these students are most likely being educated currently and why they are expected to choose the proposed charter school for their future educational needs.

Endless Sky will be located in the town of Bernalillo, NM. Our qualified, dedicated staff will serve fifth grade students from Bernalillo Elementary, and 6-8 grade students from Bernalillo Middle School.

Endless Sky will increase a young man's access to higher education by providing the following:

- 1:20 teacher to student ratio (smaller class size)
- Identification of gaps in foundational skills to support success in core content
- Intense intervention (RTI)
- An all-boys environment will provide engaging presentation of subjects that are typically seen as female-oriented in co-ed schools.
- Educators will have the opportunity to focus on the way boys learn by embracing the fact that boys learn differently from girls, thus increasing engagement and overall learning.

- Parent participation through weekly detailed communication
- The opportunity for individualized RTI combined with a larger percentage of the school day dedicated to closing the students learning gaps.

Bernalillo Elementary in 2017 received a grade of C from the NMPED; Bernalillo Middle School received an F in 2017. For the past three years, male students attending 5th grade at Bernalillo Elementary and 6-8 at Bernalillo Middle School have never achieved more than 21% proficient in reading and 22% proficient in math. In some years, these percentages fell below 10%.

Endless Sky will effectively target male students who need individualized intervention and low class sizes. Our goals is to fill in the gaps for students who are passed to the next grade level each year without learning the standards and skills they need to be successful. These are the students whose parents are currently paying out of pocket expenses for tutors and online programs to help their children catch up; also, parents who choose to home school their students, due to large class sizes and lack of communication and interventions; as well as the parents who are investing countless hours working with their children in the evening. These parents and students would benefit greatly from a school that would build individualized RTI into the curriculum, communicate regularly, and have a 1:20 student to teacher ratio.
