Kentucky Mesa Charter School seeks to educate and develop future citizen leaders with a focus on core educational standards in a safe, structured academic environment which allows for rigorous learning, character development, and opportunities for growth.

For the first year we anticipate enrolling 18-25 English-speaking students in Grades 1-5 from the diverse				
communities of Kirtland, Fruitland, and Waterflow that are not being allowed to excel in the current Central				
Consolidated School District, but wish to be challenged.

Within Central Consolidated School District, very few schools have recently made AYP and even fewer are				
excelling, so parents are actively looking for alternative programs.

Grades 1-5 will have at least a 7-hour school day and will exceed the minimum required number of days in school by at least 7 days. We seek to recruit and retain the highest quality teachers and implement a school governance structure that emphasizes accountability from the bottom up with the help of a school council involving both parents and teachers. We will involve our students in caring for their school to develop pride in their education.

11. How the school will be more effective than the schools currently serving the targeted student population, and/or plans to improve student achievement and exceed the academic performance of existing public schools in the targeted service area and any data you have to support this assumption.

Improve the learning environment with a zero-tolerance behavior policy and structured classroom which fosters integrity, inquiry-based learning where it is safe to learn from trial and error, creativity and ultimately high-academic achievement which will better prepare our children for post-secondary education and serving and working in the real world.
