NOTICE OF INTENT TO SUBMIT CHARTER APPLICATION, 2013

INSTRUCTIONS

According to NMSA § 22-8B-6(B) the Notice of Intent to Submit a Charter Application ("NOI") must be filed by the organizers of a proposed charter school to the Public Education Commission at the address below <u>AND</u> to the superintendent of the school district in which the charter school is proposed to be located. Failure to notify may result in your application being rejected.

This year the NOI must be submitted by 5:00 PM Mountain Time on <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>January 8</u>, <u>2013</u>. Notices of Intent that are not received by the Public Education Commission and the superintendent of the local school district by the January 8, 2013 deadline may result in the application being rejected. When you send the NOI to the superintendent of the school district in which your charter is to be located, you are strongly encouraged to send it by certified mail return receipt requested, or request a signed receipt when you deliver the NOI. Contact the local district regarding electronic filing.

Barack Obama Charter will address the student population that have not achieved proficiency on the academic areas of SBA. Drs. Bauer and Webb are experts in this area.

Identify where these students are most likely being educated currently and why they are expected to choose
the proposed charter school for their future educational needs.

Students in Barack Obama Charter are currently failing in public schools, have already dropped out or are trying to be served in unaccredited home school environments. Students in the public schools not only don't pass the SBA, the schools produce no documentation on how to assure future student success.

Provide evidence that the applicant team has assessed community need for a school of the nature that will be
proposed in the application (e.g., objective surveys or other measures of local demand for the proposed educational
program).

Southwest Learning System, of which part of Barack Obama Charter is modeled after, reports strong demand for its educational services throughout New Mexico and particularly Sandoval and Bernalillo Counties. SLS does not appear to serve students who have less than proficient scores on SBA. The huge population of non-proficient students SLS does not serve should have an equal opportunity.

10. Identify significant innovative features that the school will implement in order to help it realize its vision / mission (e.g., non-traditional school year, longer school day, partner organizations, etc.).

SLS and RISC both offer features not currently being pursued in public schools. Both will contribute significant innovative features including being a truly standards based, instead of social based, school.

Describe how the school will be more effective than the schools currently serving the targeted student population, and/or plans to improve student achievement and exceed the academic performance of existing public schools in the targeted service area and any data you have to support this assumption.

All enrolled students will be given the goal/challenge to demonstrate proficiency on the SBA. Given the data produced by NM PED massive numbers of students have not, do not and will not have even the most basic skills necessary to make the state of New Mexico economically viable.

Please Note: Should your charter be awarded, the founding governing body could undergo a background check to determine if it qualifies to be a board of public finance in the state of New Mexico.
