NOTICE OF INTENT TO SUBMIT CHARTER APPLICATION, 2014

INSTRUCTIONS

According to NMSA § 22-8B-6(B) the Notice of Intent to Submit a Charter Application ("NOI") must be filed by the organizers of a proposed charter school to the Public Education Commission at the address below <u>AND</u> to the superintendent of the school district in which the charter school is proposed to be located. Failure to notify may result in your application being rejected.

This year the NOI must be submitted by 5:00 PM Mountain Time on Monday, January 13, 2014. Notices of Intent that are not received by the Public Education Commission and the superintendent of the local school district by the January 13, 2014 deadline may result in the application being rejected. When you send the NOI to the superintendent of the school district in which your charter is to be located, you are strongly encouraged to send it by certified mail return receipt requested, or request a signed receipt when you deliver the NOI. Contact the local district regarding electronic filing.

To provide underserved elementary school children with a culturally appropriate dual language program, that blends rigorous academic preparation and honors the land the community and their cultural heritage

GISD schools - cities and towns of Anthony, Berino, Chaparral, Mesquite, Santa Teresa and Sunland Park NM

97% use Spanish as first language at home; 100% low income/ free lunch, PED measure of academic performance of public elementary schools- grade C,D and F, with one note worthy exception.

No district school has a full dual language program -k- 6, no other school honors the land the community and their agricultural heritage

Founders have meet with more than 30 community and business leaders, Founder attended community health fairs and discussed the vision with more than 300. Confirmed that GISD parents who indicte they want a full dual language k- 6 elemetrary school

Every child, from K-6 will have their own "green grow patch". All students will complete annual project based sustainable agricultural projects. Mentors from Farm and Ranch Museum,, local farmers and dairymen, as well as agricultural experts from NMSU- College of Agriculture.

Every child will have their own "green grow patch"- no other public nor charter school has this vision, nor expertise to blend a rigorous dual language academic program with a green sustainable agricultural curreiculum.
