It is anticipated that the student population will focus on students in grades K-3 for the first year as there are nonline options for a significant number of families in NM. Our intent is to increase the grade spans to provide K-12 experience which focuses on literacy (K-6) and college preparatory (7-12). We anticipate that our school mirror the demographics across the state: 57% Hispanic/Latino, 29% White, 11% American Indian/Alaskan Native, 3% Black/African American, and 1% Asian or other races. It is also anticipated that 13% of students we gifted/talented, 65% eligible for free and reduced lunch, 15% ELL, and 13% special education/504's.

Our targeted population is families who are currently home-schooling and need access to highly qualified, eng teachers and a rigorous online curriculum. Literacy and parental involvement will be a key component of our school in elementary. Many families are looking for a safe environment that focuses on key academic skills the provide a foundation for the future. Our intent is to add a college preparatory focus for middle and high school students as the school expands. A college preparatory focus is only available in select locations in the state and unavailable for students statewide. Our intent is to provide this option for all students in the state.
