

Enrollment Cap Amendment Request Form

The Charter Contract, was entered into by and between the New Mexico Public Education Commission, and South Valley Prepartory School, effective 1 of July, 2015. South Valley Prepartory School was approved for a 5-YEAR TERM Charter Contract.

South Valley Prepartory School Charter Contract currently states: **ENROLLMENT CAP: 156 AUTHORIZED GRADE LEVELS: 6, 7, 8** South Valley Prepartory School requests consideration from the Public Education Commission (PEC) to change the terms of its Charter Contract, Section __8.01 (a) (i)_____, as follows: PROPOSED ENROLLMENT CAP: 210 ENROLLMENT CHANGE:

INCREASE □ DECREASE South Valley Preparatory School (SVP) is requesting an increase in our enrollment cap from 156 students to 210 students. The enrollment cap increase will allow South Valley Prepartory School (SVP) to serve additional students based on both previous and current demand. Historically, South Valley Prepartory School has held a significant waitlist in all grades. SVP, in the past, has been unable to accommodate the increase due to facility restraints. However, the school's current move has provided us with the opportunity to address the demand. The increase in the enrollment cap will serve to two goals. By increasing the number of students SVP serves through the implementation of a 3rd family strand, SVP would be able to decrease the number of students in each homeroom class. This would provide a higher quality learning and teaching environment for everyone. Secondly, the increase in enrollment and the resulting addition of the third family strand will allow SVP to better address the cultural and language needs of the families from the communities we serve. The phased in third family strand will provide SVP more flexibility in staffing that will allow us to build a foundation to support high quality bilingual services. These programs will provide a continuum for the community we serve. SVP recently moved to the very edge of the South Valley and into the San Jose neighborhood. Both the South Valley and particularly the San Jose neighborhood are bilingual communities. SVP proposes to address a gap in quality language and cultural programming at the middle school level. South Valley Prep has recently completed the lottery for incoming Sixth grade for the 2019-2020 school year. As a result of that lottery, all 6th grade spots based on our current enrollment cap have been filled. The school currently has 30 students on the 6th grade waitlist for the upcoming 2019-2020 year, exceeding the number of students needed to implement Family Strand C. In other words, South Valley Preparatory School will meet the enrollment target for the first year, adding 6th grade, with the students that are currently on the waiting list. In addition, there will still be students left on the waitlist after the 6th grade has been filled. South Valley Preparatory School advertises once a year through a targeted mailing campaign. This last year, SVP targeted the San Jose neighborhood. We will continue to use the annual mailing campaign to help us meet our targeted enrollment.

SVP will be losing a total of 3 students from the 2018 -2019 to the 2019-2020 school year. South Valley Prep anticipates 101 of the 104 students to return for 7th and 8th grade next year. All 3 of the students unable to return will be entering the 8th grade next year. All 3 families are moving either out of the city, one to Las Cruces and one to Rio Rancho and the third family is moving from the South Valley to the far west side to the Volcano Vista High School district. SVP currently has 8 students on next year's 8th grade waitlist. SVP anticipates filling those spaces immediately.

Each year that a C family strand class is added, SVP will hire one new certified and highly qualified teacher. All teachers must hold an endorsement or be highly qualified to teach Language Arts as well as one of the following Core Content areas – Science, Social Studies, or Mathematics. In addition, SVP will work towards hiring teachers that are hold the required licensure and qualifications to support a language and cultural program that meets the requirement for the NM state Bilingual Seal. South Valley Preparatory School has already contacted several teacher candidates that fit our needs. These candidates have all expressed a desire to teach at SVP. If however these candidates do not work out, SVP will recruit staff via advertisements in a variety of media outlets. Staff training and orientation will be provided both during the summer as well as during the in-service days provided prior to classes starting.

South Valley Prep is aware of the budget needs to support the additional strand as well as any stipends that will be paid for Bilingually endorsed staff that implement programming. In addition to those particular financial needs, the school will support use Title 2 funds to contract with organizations such as Dual Language New Mexico to help build a solid plan for language and cultural learning programs prior to implementation. In addition, SVP will work closely with the Language and Cultural Bureau at the PED for support in meeting all state mandates and regulations in regards to programming.

As previously noted, South Valley Preparatory recently moved into a new building at the beginning of the 2018-2019 school year. This building is 22,000 square feet. The PSFA has documented that the building we occupy has the capacity of 222 students. SVP has one classroom immediately available to provide the space for the new 6th grade class. With the addition of the 7th and 6th grade classes for Family Strand C, the second level of the building provides enough space to serve for 2 additional classrooms with minor construction. The school currently has capital outlay money available to complete the minor construction needed.

South Valley Preparatory school made the final payment on the building on February 11, 2019. The school is currently working with legal counsel to complete the transfer of the title to the building to South Valley Prepartory School. This should be completed by the end of May 2019. SVP will use it's existing Capital Outlay, HB33 and SB 9 monies to pay for the necessary construction needed upstairs to convert the office spaces into classrooms. Other concrete resources that will be needed include curriculum books / textbooks for each year for each additional class as well as an additional set of classroom computers.

I have done some analysis of the plans you provided and my findings are as follows:

Maximum number of students allowed is approximately 234 students (assuming rooms 20, 23, 24, 25, 27, 30, 48, 49, 50 are going to be utilized as classrooms). Calculated by 6578/28.

Maximum occupant load as calculated per the International Building Code regulations is approximately 570 people.
