

## Introduction to the CRRSA/ESSER II Application System



## Tips for using the CRRSA/ESSER II application system

#### 1. Internet Explorer

The CRRSA/ESSER II application is built on a Microsoft platform. The application operates optimally in Internet Explorer.

#### 2. Save and refresh

Use the SAVE button and browser refresh button frequently.

#### 3. Complete the modules in order


The modules build upon each other.

#### 4. Editing modules

To open and edit the application modules, use the edit icon:



#### 5. Toolbar



The toolbar is located at the top of each module. It can be used in addition to or in place of the **Save** and **Cancel** buttons located at the bottom of each module.

#### 6. Username and password

Each LEA will have one username and one password. It is best if only one authorized user is accessing the application at a time. The system will save only one user's work at a time, and having multiple users in the application simultaneously will cause errors. If you need assistance with usernames and passwords for the application, please contact your SSFS Bureau representative (see <u>Appendix 1</u>).

If you see the window shown below, select the second item in the drop-down menu, "Windows authentication." It will then prompt you for your username and password.



When prompted, log in to the application:

- 1. Enter your username

- 3. Click the "OK" button



In the application, enter district contact information:


- **1.** Fill out the contact information for your LEA's representative.

## **Budget Table**

This table provides a running balance of funds available as the application is completed. When a module has been completed for which funds have been allocated, the total of that module will be added to the debit line, which is then subtracted from the balance.

The update link functions as a refresh button. Each time you make a new entry, you can click the update button to see the current budget status. You can also use the browser refresh button to accomplish the same result.

## **Required information**

- Click on the edit icon to access the module. The six questions are identical to the Required Information portion of the CARES application.
- Check the box below the questions to indicate that the responses to the questions can be found in the LEA's previously submitted CARES application.
- Click the "Save" button at the bottom of the required information page.
  - 1. Provide a description of the steps the LEA will take to ensure compliance with Section 427 of the General Education Provision Act (GEPA), 20 U.S.C. 1228a. The description must include information on the steps the LEA proposes to take to permit students, teachers, and other program beneficiaries to overcome barriers (including barriers based on gender, race, color, national origin, disability, and age) that impede access to, or participation in, the program(s) for which you are submitting this funding request.
  - 2. Outline the LEA's proposed timeline for providing services and assistance to students and staff.
  - Describe how the LEA will determine its most important educational needs as a result of COVID19.
  - 4. Explain how the LEA intends to use ESSER funds to promote remote learning. Due to the nature of the pandemic and COVID-19 itself, it is likely that we may need to continue, or return to, distance learning in the future. 


## **Indirect cost rate**

If your LEA will not claim indirect costs for the administration of CRRSA/ESSER II:


- 1. Click on the "Edit" icon to access the module.

### If your LEA will claim indirect costs for the administration of CRRSA/ESSER II:


- 1. Click on the "Edit" icon to access the module.
- 2. Enter your fixed asset amount (equipment > \$5,000) if applicable. The amount must be either 0 or greater than \$5,000.
- 3. Click "Yes."
- 4. Click "Save."

- 1. Click on the "Edit" icon to access the module.
- 2. Enter an amount for each funding use chosen.
- 3. For each amount entered, enter an explanation of how the funds will be used.
- 4. Click the "Save" icon on the toolbar at the top of the module.
