- Priority deadline:
   March 1, 2021 (Vendors will be approved to sell by June 1, 2021)
- Secondary deadline: June 1, 2021 (Vendors will be approved by September 1, 2021)

### **FARMERS** Open to All!

- 1 ATTEND Winter buyer/grower meeting, if possible
- 2 GET An Approved Supplier Packet and read through it\*
- 3 FOOD SAFETY) Train, implement, and document as required
- 4 INSURANCE Some buyers, but not all, require \$1 million in product liability
- 5 DEADLINES Follow deadlines outlined in the Approved Supplier Packet
- 6 TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE Ask for help, if needed!
- 7 SUBMIT The Approved Supplier Program Application
- 8 COMMUNICATE With buyers!

#### **BUYERS** Get to Know Your Farmers!

- 1 ATTEND Winter buyer/grower meeting, if possible
- 2 GET An Approved Supplier Packet and read through the section for buyers.\*
- 3 KNOW Your farmers will have met necessary food safety requirements
- Your needs using cycle menus, velocity reports, and production records. Determine product and quantity needed based on your projected frequency of use. Use the Seasonality Chart and Product and Price Guide to inform your projections.\*
- 5 INSURANCE Some buyers, but not all, require \$1 million in product liability
- With farmers! Let them know your projected needs, including product specifications and delivery expectations. Use the Price and Availability Tool when you meet with prospective farmers.
- 7 NEED HELP? If you need assistance with procurement, contracts, or budgets, ask your state agency for assistance
