SECTION III: NARRATIVE

BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis: Senate Bill 115 (SB115) would require daycare centers and schools to notify the parent or guardian of a child or student if the child or student does not arrive at the daycare center or school within one hour after the child’s or student’s scheduled arrival time, unless the parent or guardian has provided an excuse. The bill would require the parent or guardian to provide the daycare center or school their preferred method of contact for such notices.

The Public Education Department’s (PED) analysis will focus specifically on how the bill impacts student attendance requirements.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

SB115 does not contain an appropriation.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

SB115 supports the existing requirements of [Section 22-12A-1 NMSA 1978, the Attendance for Success Act](#), that focus on early prevention and intervention, including documenting accurate daily class and school day attendance, notifying parents that a student is absent from class or the school day, and establishing an early warning system that identifies students at risk of chronic absenteeism or excessive absenteeism.

Public district and charter schools maintain an attendance policy that requires notice to the parents or guardians of a student if that student has not arrived at the school within one hour after the student’s scheduled arrival time for that day unless an excuse for the absence has been provided by the parent or guardian.

PERFORMANCE IMPLICATIONS

Notifying parents may be particularly difficult at large high schools in which many students have different scheduled arrival times.
