



Starting in spring 2021, the state adopted the NM-MSSA Spanish Language Arts (SLA) assessment for grades 3-8 replacing the Spanish Reading Standards Based Assessment (SBA) for grades 3-8. As a result, the Spanish Reading SBA is only offered at the high school level as a summative assessment. This test is offered 100% in Spanish.



Who takes the Spanish Reading SBA in 2021-2022?

Eligible New Mexico high school (grade 11) students in their first three years in U.S. schools or in their 4th or 5th years with approved EL Waiver will take the spring 2022 Spanish Reading SBA.



What does the test measure?

The Spanish Reading SBA is intended to measure how well a student has gained the knowledge and skills acquired as they progress towards the Common Core in Español.



When is the test given?

The administration window for the Spanish Reading SBA will be March 28 – May 6, 2022. Access the [Online Interactive Calendar](#) for all assessment administration and training dates.



How is the test administered?

The Spanish Reading SBA will be administered on paper only, in three sessions. The assessment will also be available for students that may need Large Print or Braille versions of the test.
