

# Setting the Standards

The story of how knowledge becomes curriculum.



Standards are identified by state as needing revision and are typically updated every 10 years.

Educators are engaged to crosswalk with the old standards, receive professional development in writing standards, and then begin the process of writing or moving to review and adopt a national set of standards.



The state engages experts in the field to support the process, including setting vision, looking at other resources, and establishing process for writing the standards or adopting a national set of standards.

The work concludes with a full set of K-12 standards, which then undergo the state's rule-making process, requiring public notice of the proposed rule change, a minimum 30-day public comment period, and a public hearing.



Focus groups are engaged throughout the process to ensure transparency.

The FINAL RULE is filed with the New Mexico State Records Center and Archives and is implemented in the classroom.
