- Student Strategy Discussions: JKS discussed AGC difficulty with some basic math concepts. The team strategized on ways to address this deficit. The focus will be basic addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. Her MLSS Edgenuity course will be disabled and she will work on more hands-on activities with manipulatives and activities to provide her with the repetition needed to commit the processes of these basic math concepts to memory. It was discussed that SJV is having similar difficulties. His MLSS Edgenuity math class will also be disabled and this same strategy will be used.
- **Resources:** We discussed inventorying the leftover Kumon workbooks and ordering more to provide students with some very structured basic math practice.
