## DLM Instructionally

### Embedded Window

The optional, DLM Instructionally Embedded window has closed to prepare the platform for the required End-of-Year assessment. DTCs should check student rosters loaded into Kite and remove all students not in testable grades. DLM Math and ELA should be administered in grades 3-8 and 11. DLM Science should only be administered to students in grades 5, 8, and 11. The recommended deadline to have a student's First Contact Survey (FCS) and Personal Needs Profile (PNP) completed is Monday, March 7.

## Medical Exemption Guidance

[Medical Exemptions](#) will only be granted in circumstances of serious illness, injury, or medical emergency that has been identified and verified in writing by a licensed medical professional. Generally, a student who is receiving instruction at the time of the testing window will not be eligible to receive an exemption.
