Canes of Power, narrated by Wes Studi 57 minutes

This is the story of President Lincoln's gift of engraved Canes to each of New Mexico's 19 Pueblo nations, symbolizing the recognition of their tribal sovereignty. Weaving in the history of New Mexico from European invasion until the Civil War, it explores the changes in the state's governance as it impacts Native American history and sovereignty.

The history and spirituality of the Indigenous People of the American Southwest are deeply rooted in the Land. Since the beginning of time, they have been stewards and protectors their home lands, past and present. These places intimately connect the people and their beliefs to the natural world. No place is ever abandoned; the landscape is forever living. This their story of the Land and who they are. (The specific locations and histories are Chaco Canyon, Zuni Salt Lake, Taos Blue Lake, Santa Ana Pueblo, Bears Ears, Mesa Prieta, and Santa Fe)
