MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN ALBUOUEROUE COLLEGIATE CHARTER SCHOOL AND THE ALBUOUEROUE COLLEGIATE CHARTER SCHOOL FOUNDATION

This Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") is made and entered into by and between Albuquerque Collegiate Charter School ("School") and the Albuquerque Collegiate Charter School Foundation ("Foundation"). The purpose of this MOU is to set forth the relationship between the parties.

BACKGROUND

- A. Albuquerque Collegiate Charter School is a state authorized charter school under the Charter Schools Act, NMSA 1978, Section 22-8B-1, et seq.
- B. The Albuquerque Collegiate Charter School Foundation is a non-profit corporation registered with the State of New Mexico.
- C. The Foundation's sole purpose is to provide support to the school.
- D. As part of its function in supporting the School, the Foundation may help facilitate a lease to purchase arrangement with the School as provided by the Charter Schools Act, NMSA 1978, Section 22-8B-1, *et seq*.

IT IS MUTUALLY AGREED BETWEEN THE PARTIES:

- A. Albuquerque Collegiate Charter School shall remain completely independent of the Albuquerque Collegiate Charter School Foundation.
- B. Albuquerque Collegiate Charter School Foundation shall have no role in managing or overseeing the School.
- C. If the Foundation ceases to exist, it shall immediately transfer all of its remaining funds, after its liabilities and obligations have been fully satisfied, to the School.

CONFLICT OF INTEREST AND DISCLOSURE POLICY FOR THE ALBUQUERQUE COLLEGIATE CHARTER SCHOOL FOUNDATION

Article I: Purpose

The purpose of the conflict of interest policy is to protect the exempt status of the ALBUQUERQUE COLLEGIATE CHARTER SCHOOL FOUNDATION (the "organization") when it is contemplating entering into a transaction or arrangement that might benefit the private interest of an officer or director of the ALBUQUERQUE COLLEGIATE CHARTER SCHOOL FOUNDATION or might result in a possible excess benefit transaction. This policy is intended to supplement, but not replace, any applicable state and federal laws governing conflicts of interest applicable to nonprofit and charitable organizations.

Article II: Definitions

- 1. Interested Person. Any director, principal officer, or committee member who has a direct or indirect financial interest, as defined below, is an "interested person". If a person has a financial interest in any business entity, such person shall be considered to be an "interested person" in all other business entities related to such entity (by common ownership or otherwise).
- 2. Financial Interest. A person has a financial interest in a business entity if the person has, directly or indirectly, through business, investment, or family relationship:
 - a. An ownership or investment interest in any entity with which the ALBUQUERQUE COLLEGIATE CHARTER SCHOOL FOUNDATION has a transaction or arrangement,
 - b. A compensation arrangement with the ALBUQUERQUE COLLEGIATE CHARTER SCHOOL FOUNDATION or with any entity or individual with which the ALBUQUERQUE COLLEGIATE CHARTER SCHOOL FOUNDATION has a transaction or arrangement, or
 - c. A potential ownership or investment interest in, or compensation arrangement with, any entity or individual with which the ALBUQUERQUE COLLEGIATE CHARTER SCHOOL FOUNDATION is negotiating a transaction or arrangement.

Compensation includes direct and indirect remuneration as well as gifts or favors that are not insubstantial.

A financial interest is not necessarily a conflict of interest. Under Article Ill, Section 2, a person who has a financial interest shall only be deemed to have a conflict of interest only if the appropriate governing board or committee determines that a conflict of interest exists.

Article III: Procedures

- 1. Duty to Disclose. Where an actual or potential conflict of interest exists, an interested person must disclose the existence of the financial interest and shall be obligated to disclose all material facts to the directors and members of committees with governing board delegated powers that is considering a proposed transaction or arrangement.
- 2. Determining Whether a Conflict of Interest Exists. Any person or family member who has any financial interest in an entity with which the ALBUQUERQUE COLLEGIATE CHARTER SCHOOL FOUNDATION has a financial transaction shall be deemed to be a conflict of interest unless otherwise determined by independent members of the Board after full disclosure of all relevant facts concerning such financial interest. After disclosure of the financial interest and all material facts, and after any discussion with the interested person, the governing board or committee shall determine, outside of the presence of the interested person, whether a conflict of interest exists.
- 3. Procedures for Addressing the Conflict of Interest.
 - 1. An interested person may make a presentation at the governing board or committee meeting explaining why he believes his transaction or arrangement does not constitute a conflict of interest, but after the presentation, the interested person shall leave the meeting during the discussion of, and the vote on, the transaction or arrangement involving the possible conflict of interest.
 - 2. The chairperson of the board or committee shall, if appropriate, appoint a disinterested person or committee to investigate alternatives to the proposed transaction or arrangement.
 - 3. After exercising due diligence, the board or committee shall determine whether the ALBUQUERQUE COLLEGIATE CHARTER SCHOOL FOUNDATION can obtain with reasonable efforts a more advantageous transaction or arrangement from a person or entity that would not give rise to a conflict of interest.
 - 4. If a more advantageous transaction or arrangement is not reasonably possible under circumstances not producing a conflict of interest, the board or committee shall determine by a majority vote of the disinterested directors whether the transaction or arrangement is in the ALBUQUERQUE COLLEGIATE CHARTER SCHOOL FOUNDATION's best interest, for its own benefit, and whether it is fair and reasonable. In conformity with the above determination it shall make its decision as to whether to enter into the transaction or arrangement.
- 4. Violations of the Conflict of Interest Policy.
 - 1. If the board or committee has reasonable cause to believe a member has failed to disclose actual or potential conflicts of interest, it shall inform the member of the basis for such belief and afford the member an opportunity to explain the alleged failure to disclose.
 - 2. If, after hearing the member's response and after making further investigation as warranted by the circumstances, the governing board or committee determines the member has failed to disclose an actual or potential conflict of interest, it shall take appropriate disciplinary and corrective action.

Article IV: Records of Proceedings

The minutes of the board, and all committees with board delegated powers, shall contain:

- a. The names of the persons who disclosed or otherwise were found to have a financial interest in connection with an actual or possible conflict of interest, the nature of the financial interest, any action taken to determine whether a conflict of Interest was present, and the board's or committee's decision as to whether a conflict of interest in fact existed.
- b. The names of the persons who were present for discussions and votes relating to the transaction or arrangement, the content of the discussion, including any alternatives to the proposed transaction or arrangement, and a record of any votes taken in connection with the proceedings.

Article V: Compensation

- 1. A voting member of the board who receives compensation, directly or indirectly, from the ALBUQUERQUE COLLEGIATE CHARTER SCHOOL FOUNDATION for services is precluded from voting on matters pertaining to that member's compensation.
- 2. A voting member of any committee whose jurisdiction includes compensation matters and who receives compensation, directly or indirectly, from the ALBUQUERQUE COLLEGIATE CHARTER SCHOOL FOUNDATION for services is precluded from voting on matters pertaining to that member's compensation.
- 3. No voting member of the board or any committee whose jurisdiction includes compensation matters and who receives compensation, directly or indirectly, from the ALBUQUERQUE COLLEGIATE CHARTER SCHOOL FOUNDATION, either individually or collectively, is prohibited from providing information to any committee regarding compensation.

Article VI: Annual Statements

Each director, principal officer and member of a committee with board delegated powers shall annually sign a statement which affirms such person:

- 1. Has received a copy of the Conflict of Interest Policy,
- 2. Has read and understands the policy,
- 3. Has agreed to comply with the policy, and
- 4. Understands the ALBUQUERQUE COLLEGIATE CHARTER SCHOOL FOUNDATION is charitable and in order to maintain its federal tax exemption it must engage primarily in activities which accomplish one or more of its tax-exempt purposes.

Article VII: Periodic Reviews

To ensure the ALBUQUERQUE COLLEGIATE CHARTER SCHOOL FOUNDATION operates in a manner consistent with charitable purposes and does not engage in activities that could

jeopardize its tax-exempt status, periodic reviews shall be conducted. The periodic reviews shall, at a minimum, include the following subjects:

- 1. Whether compensation arrangements and benefits are reasonable, based on competent survey information, and the result of arm's length bargaining.
- 2. Whether partnerships, joint ventures, and arrangements with management organizations conform to the ALBUQUERQUE COLLEGIATE CHARTER SCHOOL FOUNDATION's written policies, are properly recorded, reflect reasonable investment or payments for goods and services, further charitable purposes and do not result in inurement, impermissible private benefit or in an excess benefit transaction.

Article VIII: Use of Outside Experts

When conducting the periodic reviews as provided for in Article VII, the ALBUQUERQUE COLLEGIATE CHARTER SCHOOL FOUNDATION may, but need not, use outside advisors, If outside experts are used, their use shall not relieve the board of its responsibility for ensuring periodic reviews are conducted.

Any person or family member who has any financial interest in an entity with which the ALBUQUERQUE COLLEGIATE CHARTER SCHOOL FOUNDATION has a financial transaction shall be deemed to be a conflict of interest unless otherwise determined by independent members of the Board after full disclosure of all relevant facts concerning such financial interest. After disclosure of the financial interest and all material facts, and after any discussion with the interested person, the governing board or committee shall determine, outside of the presence of the interested person, whether a conflict of interest exists.
- 3. Procedures for Addressing the Conflict of Interest.
 - 1. An interested person may make a presentation at the governing board or committee meeting explaining why he believes his transaction or arrangement does not constitute a conflict of interest, but after the presentation, the interested person shall leave the meeting during the discussion of, and the vote on, the transaction or arrangement involving the possible conflict of interest.
 - 2. The chairperson of the board or committee shall, if appropriate, appoint a disinterested person or committee to investigate alternatives to the proposed transaction or arrangement.
 - 3. After exercising due diligence, the board or committee shall determine whether the ALBUQUERQUE COLLEGIATE CHARTER SCHOOL FOUNDATION can obtain with reasonable efforts a more advantageous transaction or arrangement from a person or entity that would not give rise to a conflict of interest.
 - 4. If a more advantageous transaction or arrangement is not reasonably possible under circumstances not producing a conflict of interest, the board or committee shall determine by a majority vote of the disinterested directors whether the transaction or arrangement is in the ALBUQUERQUE COLLEGIATE CHARTER SCHOOL FOUNDATION's best interest, for its own benefit, and whether it is fair and reasonable. In conformity with the above determination it shall make its decision as to whether to enter into the transaction or arrangement.
- 4. Violations of the Conflict of Interest Policy.
 - 1. If the board or committee has reasonable cause to believe a member has failed to disclose actual or potential conflicts of interest, it shall inform the member of the basis for such belief and afford the member an opportunity to explain the alleged failure to disclose.
 - 2. If, after hearing the member's response and after making further investigation as warranted by the circumstances, the governing board or committee determines the member has failed to disclose an actual or potential conflict of interest, it shall take appropriate disciplinary and corrective action.

Article IV: Records of Proceedings

The minutes of the board, and all committees with board delegated powers, shall contain:

- a. The names of the persons who disclosed or otherwise were found to have a financial interest in connection with an actual or possible conflict of interest, the nature of the financial interest, any action taken to determine whether a conflict of Interest was present, and the board's or committee's decision as to whether a conflict of interest in fact existed.
- b. The names of the persons who were present for discussions and votes relating to the transaction or arrangement, the content of the discussion, including any alternatives to the proposed transaction or arrangement, and a record of any votes taken in connection with the proceedings.

Article V: Compensation

- 1. A voting member of the board who receives compensation, directly or indirectly, from the ALBUQUERQUE COLLEGIATE CHARTER SCHOOL FOUNDATION for services is precluded from voting on matters pertaining to that member's compensation.
- 2. A voting member of any committee whose jurisdiction includes compensation matters and who receives compensation, directly or indirectly, from the ALBUQUERQUE COLLEGIATE CHARTER SCHOOL FOUNDATION for services is precluded from voting on matters pertaining to that member's compensation.
- 3. No voting member of the board or any committee whose jurisdiction includes compensation matters and who receives compensation, directly or indirectly, from the ALBUQUERQUE COLLEGIATE CHARTER SCHOOL FOUNDATION, either individually or collectively, is prohibited from providing information to any committee regarding compensation.

Article VI: Annual Statements

Each director, principal officer and member of a committee with board delegated powers shall annually sign a statement which affirms such person:

- 1. Has received a copy of the Conflict of Interest Policy,
- 2. Has read and understands the policy,
- 3. Has agreed to comply with the policy, and
- 4. Understands the ALBUQUERQUE COLLEGIATE CHARTER SCHOOL FOUNDATION is charitable and in order to maintain its federal tax exemption it must engage primarily in activities which accomplish one or more of its tax-exempt purposes.

Article VII: Periodic Reviews

To ensure the ALBUQUERQUE COLLEGIATE CHARTER SCHOOL FOUNDATION operates in a manner consistent with charitable purposes and does not engage in activities that could

jeopardize its tax-exempt status, periodic reviews shall be conducted. The periodic reviews shall, at a minimum, include the following subjects:

- 1. Whether compensation arrangements and benefits are reasonable, based on competent survey information, and the result of arm's length bargaining.
- 2. Whether partnerships, joint ventures, and arrangements with management organizations conform to the ALBUQUERQUE COLLEGIATE CHARTER SCHOOL FOUNDATION's written policies, are properly recorded, reflect reasonable investment or payments for goods and services, further charitable purposes and do not result in inurement, impermissible private benefit or in an excess benefit transaction.

Article VIII: Use of Outside Experts

When conducting the periodic reviews as provided for in Article VII, the ALBUQUERQUE COLLEGIATE CHARTER SCHOOL FOUNDATION may, but need not, use outside advisors, If outside experts are used, their use shall not relieve the board of its responsibility for ensuring periodic reviews are conducted.

Each director, principal officer and member of a committee with board delegated powers has received a copy of this Conflict of Interest Policy, has read and understand the Policy, has agreed to comply with the Policy, and understands the ALBUQUERQUE COLLEGIATE CHARTER SCHOOL FOUNDATION is charitable and in order to maintain its federal tax exemption it must engage primarily in activities which accomplish one or more of its tax-exempt purposes.
