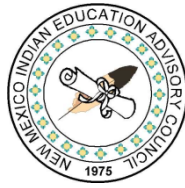

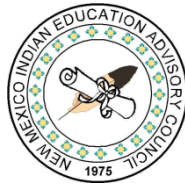

Patricia: We need some alignment to help support IED            Jeremy: We need both alignment and autonomy due to the changing dynamics of leadership at the state level. If advisements are going to be considered for the legislative session, IEAC would need them completed before September.
