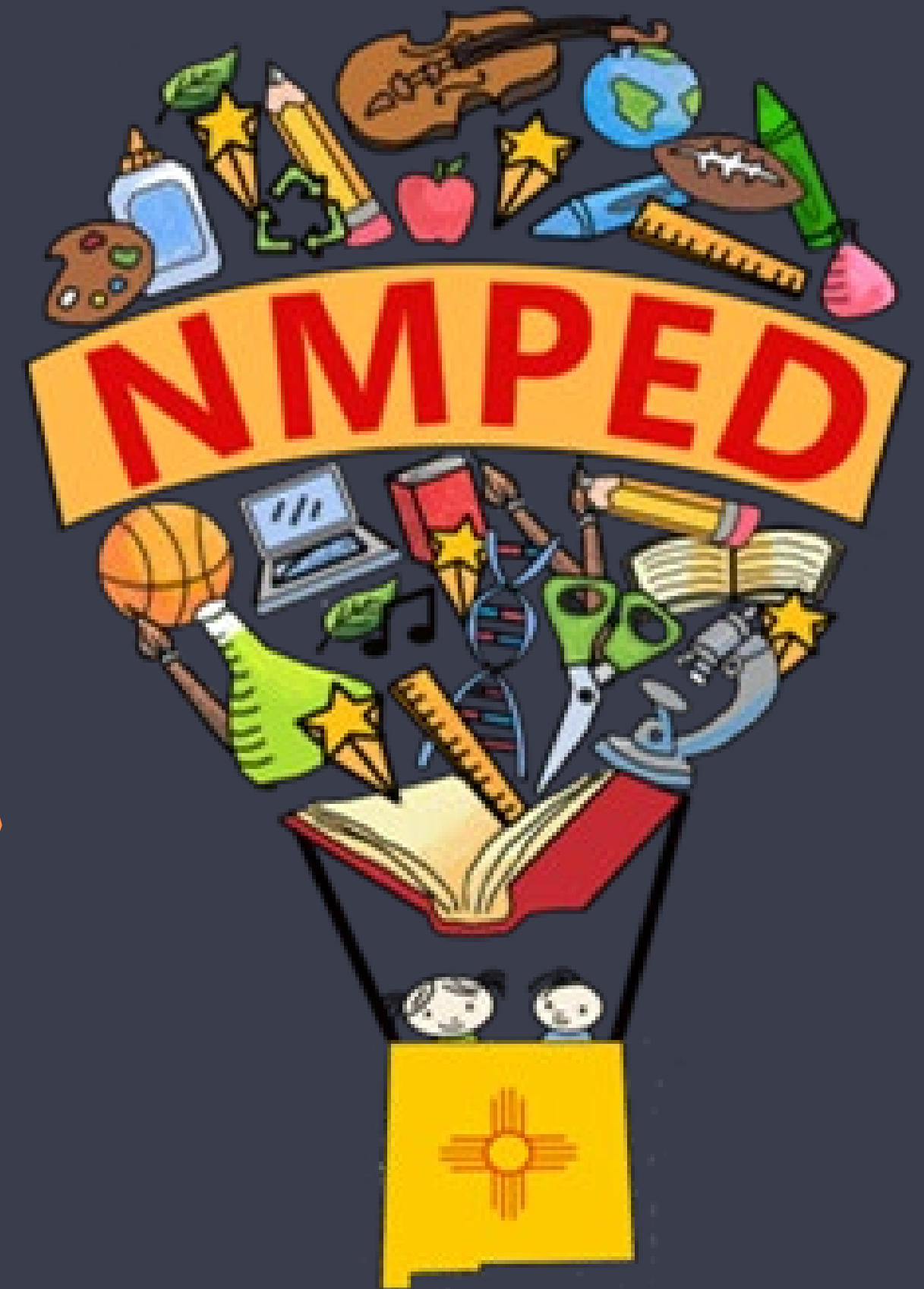

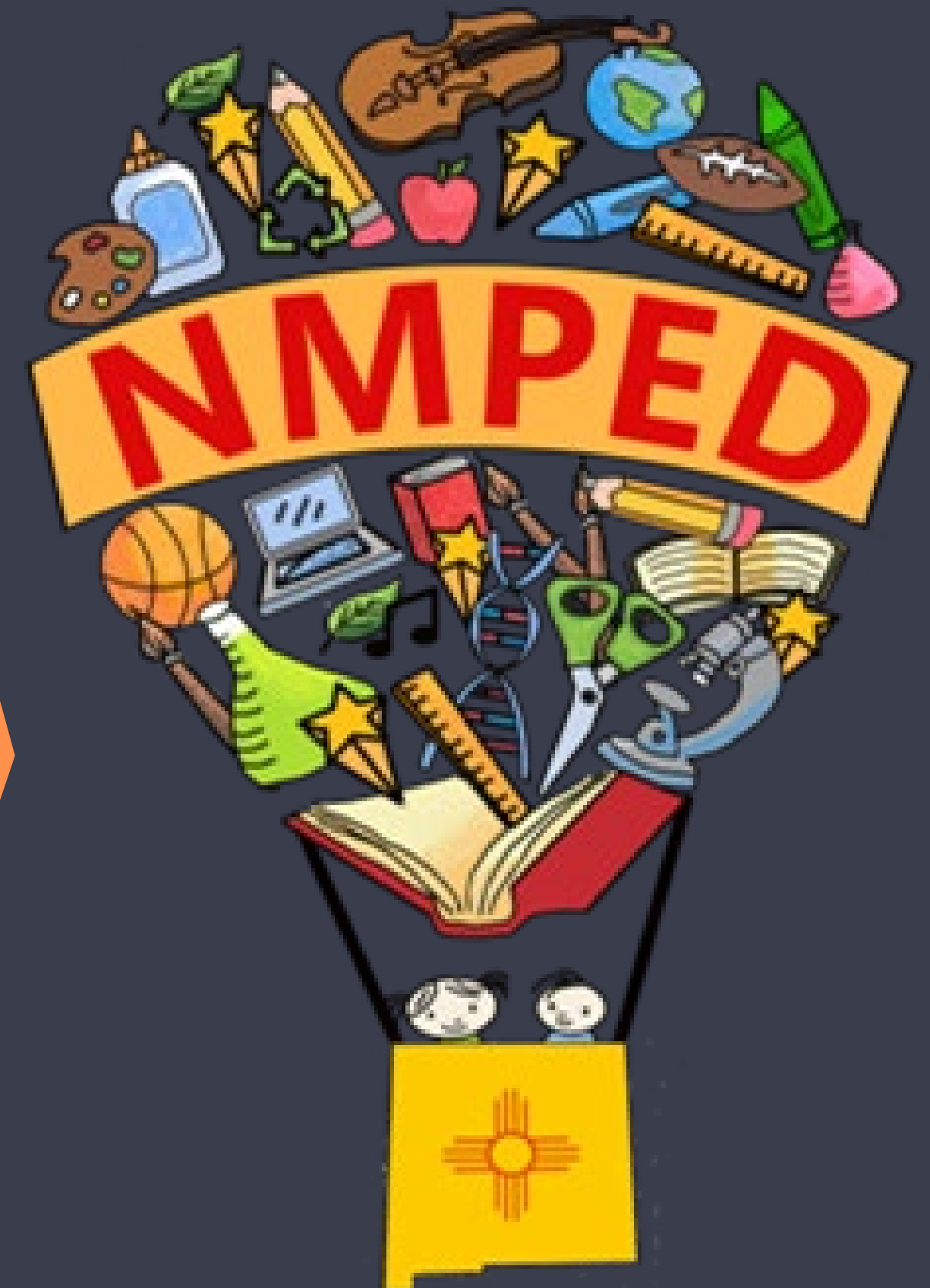

The Why?



By Election Day, an estimated 8 million young people will have turned 18 since the 2020 general election.

If young people are engaged this year, they have the power to influence the 2022 Midterm Elections in some of the most competitive states.

Young people have the power to decide who the next senators and governors will be across the country, especially in states like Pennsylvania, Wisconsin, Georgia, Arizona, and Florida.

New Mexico



As of 2020 New Mexico has a population of 2.097 million individuals.

In 2020 21% of eligible voters were young voters (18-29) and only 39% voted in the 2020 elections (the lowest rate in last couple of elections).

As of January 2022 New Mexico had 1,342,690 individuals registered to vote.

New Mexico: Facts

Last day to register online is Oct 11. or by mailing ballot before Oct. 11

Early voting in person is open from Oct. 11- Nov. 5

Samde day registration on election day Nov 8.

ID is required for first time voters only (student ID acceptable)

Students who are 17 years old and will turn 18 by the election can pre-register to vote
