Who takes the SAT School Day?

All 11th grade students in New Mexico public schools will participate in the SAT during the school day in spring 2023, except for those students with significant cognitive disabilities who take the alternate assessment based upon an IEP. Any cohort 2023 graduate who did not take the SAT during the spring 2022 summative window is encouraged but not required to test during the spring 2023 administration.



How can students and teachers prepare?

All skills and knowledge measured on the SAT are found in the [New Mexico Adopted Common Core State Standards](#). Educators can learn more by reviewing the [SAT Suite of Assessments Teacher Implementation Guide](#), a resource created for teachers and curriculum specialists to generate ideas about integrating SAT practice and skill development into the classroom.

- Educators also have access to the [SAT Suite Question Bank](#) to develop formative assessments out of released SAT test items.
- To help educators better understand how to use the SAT Suite Question Bank in their classrooms, the PED has collaborated with the Center for Assessment to provide short online courses in the Canvas platform for [Math](#) and [ELA](#) teachers.

Students can access a personalized SAT practice program with [Khan Academy](#) for free along with multiple full-length practice tests.



How is the test administered?

The spring 2023 SAT School Day is primarily administered digitally, with a paper and pencil option available upon request for schools that do not meet the minimum technical requirements necessary for digital testing.

- The test is administered during the school day in three sections: Reading, Writing and Language, and Mathematics.
- The essay section has been removed. The SAT is a timed test.

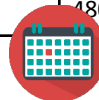

Test scores range from 400-1600 for the mathematics and reading/writing sections combined.
