2021-22 Statewide Summative Assessment Data




- i. The school implements a curriculum that utilizes project-based learning and thematic units with student presentations and exhibitions of learning projects.

Schools with an overall score that places them in the top 25% of schools in the state are awarded the Spotlight designation. Schools that score in the top 10% for any individual


measure in the accountability system are awarded a Designation of Excellence (DOE) for that measure.






High School Graduation Rates:









Career & College Program Participation:
