School response:

As expected when new schools are adding grade levels and increasing student enrollment, there is some year-to-year variance in expenditures allocated for direct instruction, maintenance and operations, and administrative functions. In addition, grant awards for specific years may also lead to changes in expenditure rates. Albuquerque Collegiate has consistently prioritized investment of resources in curricular and professional development programs, and that investment has been reflected in the resulting academic performance. Albuquerque Collegiate will continue to prioritize student-centered spending and academic outcomes, even as enrollment growth will necessarily result in investment in expanded facilities.

Albuquerque Collegiate has received several large grant funds which have influenced how its operational expenses have been divided. In FY2019, the majority of the school's instructional expenses were expensed through our CSP grant, while in FY2021 and FY2022 the school had substantial federal CARES and ESSER funding that was prioritized for instruction. Albuquerque Collegiate hired additional teachers to help with learning loss and spent funds on additional cleanings at the school to ensure the school was a safe environment for scholars. Since schools are directed to first spend down time-limited grant funds over operational funds that can be carried over as needed, operational expenditures on functions related to those grants will vary from year-to-year.
