# **ABQ BioPark Zoo's Asia Expansion**

On March 1, 2023, a group of students from Albuquerque's ACE Leadership High School were given a tour of the new ABQ BioPark Zoo's Asia Expansion Construction site. Led by NMPED College & Career Coach Denise Ojeda and hosted by Bradbury Stamm Construction Project Manager and site Superintendent Aaron Stricker, the group of exhibit space. Opening had been delayed five students were given a deluxe excursion around the newly developed 4.5 acres as well as expert insights into the many tracks available for working in the trades at all levels.

# **The Project**

The \$28 million project, which is being funded by a voter-approved Gross Receipts Tax passed in 2016, is being headed up by contractors Hartman + Majewski Design Group, CLR Design and Bradbury Stamm Construction. The exhibit is a 21<sup>st</sup> Century model of modern zoologic habitat construction that looks to invoke the varied habitats of Asia. Future guests will experience the tropical jungles and fauna of Expansion showcase the many and varied

Southeast Asia, the Himalayas, and the coasts of Japan and northeast Russia. Interactive learning opportunities will be featured throughout the exhibit.

# What is a Pre-Apprenticeship Program?<sup>(1)</sup>

Pre-Apprenticeship is a program or set of strategies that is designed to prepare individuals to enter and succeed in a Registered Apprenticeship Program (RAP).

# What are the Elements of a Quality Pre -Apprenticeship Program?<sup>(1)</sup>

Quality pre-apprenticeship programs can play a valuable role in providing work-based learning to help people prepare for an entry-level RAP. While Pre-Apprenticeship programs have varied designs and approaches, the Department of Labor has outlined the elements of a quality pre-

apprenticeship program that can place an individual on the potential career pathway to employability though a RAP:

- \* APPROVED CURRICULUM -Training that is based on industry standards and approved by a RAP partner
- \* **SIMULATED EXPERIENCE** Hands-on training or volunteer opportunities that do not displace paid employees
- \* **FACILITATED ENTRY** Agreements with RAP sponsors that allow program participants to enter directly into a RAP
- \* INCREASED DIVERSITY Recruit and prepare underrepresented populations to be successful in a RAP. learn more about Diversity and Inclusion
- \* SUPPORTIVE SERVICES Wrap-around services or referrals to help participants complete the program (i.e. childcare, transportation)
- \* SUSTAINABLE PARTNERSHIPS Collaboratively promote Registered Apprenticeship to other employers


# **CTE Helps Improve Attendance**

In New Mexico, about 40 percent of students in public schools are chronically absent, and that puts students at risk of dropping out and having lower academic outcomes. Chronic absence — missing 10 percent or more of school days due to absence for any reason—excused, unexcused absences and suspensions, can translate into third-graders unable to master reading, sixth-graders failing subjects and ninth-graders dropping out of high school.

In 2019, the New Mexico Legislature passed the Attendance for Success Act, requiring all public school districts in the state to provide early interventions for students who are absent or chronically absent, have a plan to re-engage students and collect data that will help foster continuous improvement going forward. A quality Career Technical Education, especially STEM related CTE, is shown to improve attendance by re-engaging students. CTE is another tool that schools have in order to lower the chronic absentee rate.



One Nebraska school took it one step further:

They made work-based learning a priority and it worked. "My experience has been that it's a very powerful engagement strategy," said Jon Cerny, the superintendent of Bancroft-Rosalie Community Schools in rural Nebraska during an Education Week K12 Essentials Forum earlier this year. His district allows every senior to spend their Fridays either doing an internship or other work-based learning experience or taking online courses.

The CTE experiences also help students better understand how their coursework will matter in the working world. Students in manufacturing programs of study might start to understand why their geometry class was necessary, said one educator. Once students see the connections, they work harder in those classes, understand the importance of hands-on experiences they might have in real life. Most importantly, they want to come to school because they love their CTE class.

Finally, it seems that the education world is coming to the realization that CTE isn't just for some students, it's for all students.

The Public Education Department has an <u>Attendance Dashboard</u> that allows the public to see state, district and school level attendance reports from 2018-2022. The 2022-2023 data will be available after the End Of Year reporting period in May.


