Reasons for adopting rule:

The purpose of the rulemaking is to align existing coaching licensure requirements with 22-13-31.2 NMSA 1978, which requires all licensed coaches employed by school districts to have current certification in cardiopulmonary resuscitation. The statute requires that the certification program include training regarding the use of automated external defibrillators.

Rule information:

The rule mandates current certification cardiopulmonary resuscitation, including use of an automated external defibrillator, for all licensed coaches.

The Department reviewed and considered all written and oral feedback received during the public comment period. Response to Public Comment
6.63.8 NMAC, Licensure in Athletic Coaching, 7-12

Public Comment Period: May 16, 2023, to June 21, 2023

The New Mexico Public Education Department (PED) received public comments from 2 organizations for 6.63.8 NMAC, Licensure in Athletic Coaching, 7-12. All substantive comments have been summarized below. Comments that are not substantive in nature or fall outside the scope of the rule have not been included.

Certification	
Summary of Comments	PED Response
The Department should specify that only hands-on certification in cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR), including training in the use of an automated external defibrillator (AED), should be accepted.	The Department considered this suggestion and added the requirement that the CPR/AED certification shall be in-person and hands-on.
Questions regarding the process for collecting and approving certification, specifically whether schools should be responsible for ensuring coaches keep their CPR/AED certification up to date.	Section 22-13-31.2 NMSA 1978 requires all licensed coaches employed by school districts to maintain current CPR/AED certification. Because coaching licenses are defined in Department rule, to comply with the law, the Department has included the requirement of current CPR certification in the requirements for licensure. In response to public comment, the Department has also added the requirement that schools shall verify that coaches maintain current CPR/AED training.
Concerns that the implementation timeline was too short.	Because Senate Bill 450, School Coach CPR & AED Training , codified as Section 22-13-31.2 NMSA 1978 , became effective June 16, 2023, the effective date of the requirements was not within the Department's control.
