School response: Southwest Secondary Learning Center prioritizes spending on direct student instruction. The State Equalization Guarantee (SEG) funds are used primarily for teacher salaries and benefits to support student learning. Federal grants including IDEA and Title funds are also prioritized towards salaries and benefits to directly impact student success. Special Capital Outlay funds are requested each year to facilitate improvements to the facility including upgraded computer hardware for students, security improvements, LED lighting, and sound abatement. SSLC has met fiscal standards set forth in the PEC Performance Framework and the Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP). While there have been 2 audit findings (including FY19 before the contract term), corrective action plans were developed and implemented to address both. The findings have not been repeated. SSLC has strong financial controls and stewardship of public funds.
