Discussion on Tiwa language program in the event current teacher leaves to pursue his master's degree. Requirements of Tiwa instructor as a PISD employee were also discussed.

Discussion of partnership with district to pursue internship or work study programs with tribal departments in order to expand our college and career readiness program. Identifying and connecting individuals from district and tribe to coordinate placement opportunities for 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> grade students.

Discussion of GO Bond election and requested permission to place signs on tribal land for public viewing.

Discussion on data sharing agreement and if review and recommendation for changes/addition are in order.
