Mission: The mission of the Southwest Secondary Learning Center is to sustain a high performing learning community by preparing computer-literate students for college or a career through a blended learning model that is individualized, self-directed and flexible.

Educational Program of School as written in the contract:

- i. The Southwest Secondary Learning Center provides students with a flexible schedule where students can choose from daily sessions, four days a week beyond the traditional school hours. The classes are taught through a blended learning model. Core classes are taught through online programs purchased by the school. The classrooms/main lab (the computer lab) are staffed by content area teachers during each session who assist the students with questions that they have with the content being presented online. Additionally, each student has a sponsor teacher that ensures that the student is on track with the online program to ensure that there is appropriate progress being made towards course completion and

towards graduation.

- ii. Southwest Secondary Learning Center students are provided with a high tech elective, Smart Lab, offered Secondary in grades Learning 9 through 12 (required in grades 9-10 and offered to grades 11-12). The Smart Lab is a 21st century classroom that meets career cluster and workplace readiness competencies. Students are exposed to the 8 systems of technology coupled with high speed Internet connections, advanced graphic arts, computer aided drawing, movie special effects, science data acquisition, control technologies, robotics, electric and pneumatic circuitry, publishing, computer simulation, and multimedia presentations utilizing advanced software.
- iii. The Southwest Secondary Learning Center provides students and families with a "Sponsor" teacher that acts as an intermediary to all areas of the school.
- iv. The Southwest Secondary Learning Center provides students with online courses that can be accessed 24 hours a day/7 days a week from anywhere they have access to the internet.
- v. Southwest Secondary Learning Center students have access to dual-credit college coursework.



State Accountability System:

State and federal statute mandates accountability for all public schools. This section provides a snapshot of the school’s academic performance according to data collected by the Public Education Department (PED) for the 2022-23 school year.

The New Mexico State Accountability System ([NMVISTAS](#)) gives every public school in the state an overall score. Schools were ranked by percentile within school type, with high schools being ranked separately from elementary and middle schools because of differences in how points are calculated (e.g., graduation factoring into high school but not elementary school accountability). Schools with an overall score that places them in the top 25% of schools in the state are awarded the Spotlight

designation. Schools may also receive designations of excellence in specific areas. Schools below the 75th percentile are designated either a Traditional Support School or are given one of several designations indicating a need for greater support.

Schools were ranked by percentile within school type, with high schools being ranked separately from elementary and middle schools because of differences in how points are calculated (e.g., graduation factoring into high school but not elementary school accountability).

Southwest Secondary Learning Center ranked above **65.5%** of high schools statewide. The school received a designation of **CSI – Graduation Rate** (Comprehensive Support School and Improvement Graduation rate: includes all public high schools in the state, Title I, with a four-year graduation rate below 66.67% for at least two out of the past three years.)





High School Graduation Rates:



4-Year High School Graduation by Subgroup (Cohort 2020)




4-Year High School Graduation by Subgroup (Cohort 2019)






5-Year High School Graduation by Subgroup (Cohort 2019)
