And we have paid for a contractor who has done a tremendous job. She was going to join us, but I don't know, because we are going so fast, if she is in the audience right now. She's in there? Okay.

Well, just so the Commission knows that we've contracted with a wonderful person who just, like, drove to Española nearly every single day to meet with schools to make sure that she hand-delivered school files to the schools that kids transferred from, to intervene when trash wasn't being picked up, to sorting through materials that the schools had just compiled in the cafeteria —that's what that picture is what is left of, like, probably a ten times larger pile of things.

And so I -- I think, you know, we're nearly done. I would say about the Tsay Corporation, the school's landlord has been fabulous in terms of working with us, allowing us to stay in the building as long as it took for us to empty things out.

We put out information to charter schools first and to districts, and then to others, about taking some of the materials that were there. And

if you would like to be part of the December 20 --

THE CHAIR: Thank you, Director Chavez. We're going to move on to Item No. 11, which is the Report from the Chair.

And we will have some discussion and questions, potentially, as well.

First and foremost, Report on New or Updated PEC and/or School Issues.

I just want to first thank everyone so much for this week. I've been on the other two sides of this triangle of relationships, like, from the school side, from the Charter School Division

schools got whole libraries. They got lots of great furniture, they got a ton of things.

We started with the Montessori charters getting Montessori materials. And I remember opening up a charter school on donated things from closed schools, so I know that that stuff can be really valuable to schools.

And that's what happened.

Okay. So the Item b. is about the newsletter. Excuse me. I wasn't here last month when you first started to talk about this, I think. But the idea is, you know, that the Charter Schools Division creates a monthly newsletter that we then send out to all charter schools. It's a great way for us to provide reminders to governing board members, to highlight schools, to make announcements and to share information with schools. And we do that once a month.

Our staff person -- who's not here at the moment -- but Julianna Montoya is currently the staff person in charge of drafting the newsletter.

And so we are open to the PEC adding to the newsletter, if you-all would like a PEC column or article occasionally.

We do have a bit of a tight timeline. So

side, and now I feel, like, really blessed to have such a thorough understanding of what it means to be a Public Education Commissioner and what our work really involves.

And I also just want to just commend everyone on being prepared. There's so much that we have to prepare for a week like this week. And I'm just really proud of every single one of you-all and the leadership that you exhibited in service to our schools.

And what a beautiful tapestry of schools do we have in this state. And I just wanted to make sure that all of the blood, sweat, and a little bit of tears that were exhibited this week, that they mean so much to what we do for our kids.

I'm going to break a little bit of a protocol and go to Item c. real quick here, because I think about our -- you probably saw, in 11.c. within our information, there is a really nice write-up that Naomi did for us with regard to our mission and values work.

And when I think about our values -transparency, consistency, respect, student-centered excellence, equity, and inclusion -- I think we were at our best this week in exhibiting those. I really

do.

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And I think our schools felt that. I think that we felt that from one another. And I just want to thank you all for that, because I do think we are driving towards our mission of authorizing and supporting public charter schools for innovative, equitable, choice-driven education where all New Mexico students learn and thrive.

How many of these words that I just mentioned, like, we said in the public meetings over the last four days? And my heart is full, and I know we have a lot more work to do. But I think today and this week just exhibits the PEC at our best. And so thank you for that.

I have one item underneath our -- 11.a., there's two different documents in there. The PED right now is promulgating a rule around accreditation, accountability, and accreditation procedures.

We just learned about this this week. And we have the opportunity to provide feedback by Monday. And so time is definitely of the essence. And so, through Ms. Barnes, we have drafted a letter of comment about the accreditation process. By and large, it's in here for you-all to review.

to see adjusted in the rule to allow for our charter schools to continue on their calendar, regardless of what happens with every other school in the state. And so I like the narrow focus, and I think it really is a strong statement of our support for charter autonomy.

THE CHAIR: Great. Thank you, Vice Chair. Other comments?

(Applause.)

THE CHAIR: All right. I'm going to pass the time over to Mr. Sherwood and the Public Charter Schools of New Mexico.

MR. WAYNE SHERWOOD: All right. Thank

you, Chair Brauer and Commissioners.

A couple of things. I know we're all in a -- in a bit of a hurry here.

But on Monday, next week, there is a hearing right here in this room at 1:30. And it is not going to be on Zoom. It is just going to be in person. And if you remember last year, House Bill 130 was passed to say that all schools now have to go for 180 days if you're a five-day week; and four-day week, I believe, is, like, 155.

Well, now there's a new rule being proposed that all schools will now have to go to school for 180 days. Well, that takes all these four-day-a-week schools -- which charter schools have quite a few; I wouldn't say it's the majority of charter schools, but there's quite a few charter schools that do have a four-day week -- and it would get rid of that.

So give you an example of some of them. Like Red River, where the kids are on the bus for 45 minutes one way. And when they say that they have to walk to school in the snow when it's two feet deep one way, they are not lying. The bus can't get up the hill. They park at the bottom of

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But, by and large, it's focused on making sure there is specificity in the language around charter authorizers and who actually does the, quote, unquote, accreditation for those schools. And so I wanted to point you all to that.

Can we take -- do we need to vote on that or take an action? Or do I need permission?

Yeah. And we can do that on the 13th.

So what we'll do -- like, I wanted to make sure you had a chance to review that, ask any questions at this stage, and then, in the later part of our -- in Part 13 of our agenda, I'm going to ask for you to give me permission to provide that feedback.

Vice Chair Burt.

VICE CHAIR BURT: Thanks. I did review -so there's a couple -- I like it. I'm supporting it
because the thing I like that was so focused on our
PEC comment was the impact to our authorized charter
schools. And I think the, like, concrete pieces
that we're asking for them to consider and look at
are definitely beneficial to our charter school
autonomy that we are hoping to preserve.

So I like the way it's formatted. I like the way it's very specific in which parts we'd like

the hill, and they literally hike up to the school in the snow -- in the wintertime, obviously. So they have a four-day week. It makes sense. Makes sends for parents; makes sense for kids. That's taking the autonomy away from charter schools. And that's one of the benefits of charter schools is having that autonomy. That hearing is on Monday, if you guys are in town. I won't be here. Matt and Valery will be here for Public Charter Schools of New Mexico. Come and listen to it and give your support and ideas with what you believe, also. Go ahead. (Off-mic discussion.) MR. WAYNE SHEPHERD: It is 1:30. No. No. They will not be voting on it. DIRECTOR CORINA CHAVEZ: They'll take comment. THE CHAIR: Make sure we're using our microphones as well. COMMISSIONER CARRILLO: The schedule from 1:30 to 2:30, because when I have attended one like this -- I go to ones across the street. Is it going to end at 2:30? Are they --VICE CHAIR BURT: So if nobody shows up,

be changed in the rule. That -- so rule hearings, whether you write it or say it, it's equal. It's absolutely equal amount of concern, whether you put it in writing or whether you come in person.

So that's what I would support, when we get to Item 13, authorizing the Chair to write a letter on behalf of us and submit it formally to the public -- or to the rule hearing feedback process.

And then if anyone else is, like, committed to showing up, we can also -- I mean, we can vote to authorize them to basically say what's in the letter. I don't know if that's helpful, because it's the same; it's equal weight.

So it might make more sense for everyone to come up, like, for public comment, maybe, individually, and just have the letter be our formal -- like, as a Commission? But I'm open to, like, supporting someone else coming up and speaking on behalf of the Commission.

COMMISSIONER CARRILLO: Obviously, I live here. And I was planning on coming at some point anyway. Oh, my God, all the way to Rio Chama, it wraps around?

I would say to your question, Stewart, you can use -- you can say you're a Commissioner, but

they'll sit there from 1:30 to 2:30. If 100 people show up to comment, they will stay there from 1:30 till 8:00 p.m. Everyone that signs up to comment in that hour will be heard.

COMMISSIONER CARRILLO: What's the time limit on comments; do you know?

VICE CHAIR BURT: It's usually up to the -- I would assume two minutes.

COMMISSIONER GIPSON: Yeah. They're not going to give you a lot. I literally was online for the science one. That's how far it wrapped around. But, yeah, they have to hear everyone.

COMMISSIONER CARRILLO: Did you just say the line went to Rio Chama?

COMMISSIONER GIPSON: It did. For the science? I'm not joking. It was all the way out there.

THE CHAIR: Hang on. Commissioner Ingham. COMMISSIONER INGHAM: Just what's the protocol? As far as we talked about, we would just be speaking as individuals? Is anyone going to speak for our Commission?

VICE CHAIR BURT: So that was what I was just saying. I would support the letter from the Chair that's, like, very detailed about what could

you're not speaking on behalf of the Commission. You can say that. I use that for identification

purposes, but never that I'm the voice of. THE CHAIR: Director Chavez?

DIRECTOR CORINA CHAVEZ: Yes. Commissioners, I sent the e-mail about this earlier in the week. And it is the link, too.

So if you don't have that e-mail, you can Google PED Proposed Rules. And on that website, there is an e-mail address that you can provide feedback on any

of the rules, too. And, also, there is a -- there is a rule hearing process and expectations

PowerPoint that can provide a little bit more

information for you about what to expect. And then the actual draft of the rule is there.

It is going to be heard alongside -- so

the school calendar requirements, which is 6.10.5 NMAC, is also going to be heard along the K-5 Plus schools, extended learning time program accreditation, and the requirements for non-public school accreditation. So I will be there because of that. I also oversee the non-public school

that. I also oversee the non-public school
 accreditation. So this has implications for that as
 well. Thank you.

MR. WAYNE SHERWOOD: All right. Thank

you. And also to go along with the accreditation, that's not that PCSNM is not supporting the accreditation process. They -- we are not supporting that the accreditation process be a process. And also the site visits yearly, that they need to be combined together in part of one process instead of two individual processes.

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Because charter schools, right now, are already going through an accreditation process. So we don't want to be having double of everything. And that has to be very clearly written in the rule, that charter schools are already being mandated to meet these processes and don't have to go through that other process again.

And I'm going to move on.

We have some legislative priorities, because I don't know if we're going to meet before the legislative session begins.

PCSNM supports that adjustment to lease assistance policy to maximize charter school facility funds. That's really nothing new; we've done that every year.

We support legislation that specifically allows authorizers to reduce the amount of SEG they withhold from charter schools and provides more

We support legislation to ensure all charter schools are able to provide transportation for students.

And, last, we support budget and legislative priorities that reduce administrative burden and guide the Public Education Department to streamline administrative duties and differentiate based on the needs.

THE CHAIR: Thank you. Commissioner Carrillo.

COMMISSIONER CARRILLO: So on the transportation one, the second-to-last, does that mean that there's going -- somebody is proposing legislation specifically around that?

I know we support that. But is something coming forward? This is something that would have to be put on the call that may not likely be heard; is that correct?

MR. WAYNE SHERWOOD: Commissioner Carrillo, just like the lunches, we knew that it was coming. I -- the writing is on the wall for transportation. And maybe it's not this year during this legislative session, or next, but it's coming soon.

And that's one of the things that charter

transparency of how these funds are spent. That's the 2 percent. And I know we've discussed that a lot in here.

We support pathways for adults to continue their schooling towards a high school diploma. That was taken away a few years ago, and we're trying to get that back. There's some amazing schools that have done a great job with the adults.

We support funding priority for public charter school students regardless of which school they choose.

We support adjustments to the funding formula and equalize and reinstate Small School Size Adjustment for schools.

We support local control over budgets and calendars.

We support legislation that funds student support staff for the general student population, not just special education.

And we support funding equity and at-risk funding. We support an investigation into solutions that allow the at-risk index to fairly distribute units to schools with higher proportions of at-risk students.

And two more.

schools want to show, that they are open to all students. And one way to be open to all students is to provide transportation for those who -- who are

unable to get transportation, but it has to be funded. I mean, no --

COMMISSIONER CARRILLO: Absolutely. And part of that can probably be the mandate that school districts, where possible, share transportation and support charters in the area. There's that one district out there that knows I'm talking about them.

Okay. Do you know of any legislation so far that is a direct attack on charters, like moratoriums somebody's proposing out of the blue, or anything that you know of?

MR. WAYNE SHERWOOD: This -- not during this legislative session, I do not know of any.

COMMISSIONER CARRILLO: Okay. Good. Thank you.

THE CHAIR: Commissioner Ingham.

Particularly because of the way it was drafted the last time, it did away with the PEC in a way that you would have to draft it differently. I'm just concerned.

THE CHAIR: I think we can give that -- I'm good with giving the authority for Commissioner Gipson to work with -- if it does become transparent that we -- or apparent, rather -- that we need to have a sponsor for an amendment, that we give her the authority also to do that.
