RE: SY2023 NMVistas State and Local Educational Agency (LEA) Report Card

Release

The *Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965* (ESEA), as amended by the *Every Student Succeeds Act* (ESSA), requires state agencies to publish state and Local Educational Agency (LEA) report cards that provide information on state, LEA, and school performance on a variety of indicators that is understandable and consistent.

This memorandum provides an update on PED's SY2023 ESSA-compliant accountability reporting activities. As a reminder, PED previously released school designations and school-level data on NMVistas on November 17, 2023.

Spring 2023 Achievement Data

The Spring 2023 school-level achievement data is no longer embargoed and should be used within the school NM DASH plans. Grade-level achievement data will be published in quarter one of 2024.

State and LEA Report Cards

PED will publicly release the SY2023 state and LEA report cards online at <u>NMVistas</u> on Monday, January 29, 2024. The state and LEA report cards entail the following required federal accountability indicators. A summary of each federally required indicator is provided within the

Seeking Additional Assessment & Accountability Advisory Committee Members

The PED is recruiting additional members for its Assessment & Accountability Advisory Committee (AAAC). This committee provides recommendations to the Secretary of Education and the senior PED team concerning statewide assessment and accountability policies and initiatives. For the remainder of this school year and for the 2024-2025 SY, the AAAC will focus on improvements to the state's accountability system. We are seeking members with varied expertise and professional backgrounds (e.g., charter schools, community schools, CTE, English learners, students with disabilities, early literacy, & numeracy). Improving the State's Accountability System for the 2024 Report Card Cycle

In the weeks ahead, the PED, in partnership with stakeholders, technical experts, and members of the AAAC, will focus on the following initiatives:

- Facilitating statewide listening sessions for various users of accountability information, hosted by PED partners
- Solidifying the documentation of all relevant business rules used to calculate the
 accountability indicators and all relevant determinations to ensure transparency and
 consistency
- Supporting an external audit of accountability processes and procedures to create efficiencies in reporting
- Developing Accountability literacy resources
- Producing a Report Card that not only contains all the data educators need to make plans and decisions but presents the data in an easy-to-understand manner for families and communities to understand how their schools are doing. Although there is no federal

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requirement for LEA reports cards to be provided in hard copy format, the PED plans to produce PDFs of district report cards for the 2023-24SY release.
