

An internal team from NMPED (REA & Community Schools) will collaborate with Apex as the group evaluates implementation and outcomes of CS. SY24-25 COMMUNITY SCHOOLS GRANT APPLICATIONS

The New Mexico Public Education Department (NMPED) Community Schools (CS) team is excited to announce the Community Schools Grant applications for SY 24-25. The applications are open to all public schools (including district and state charters) that qualify as a schoolwide Title I school. The grants available (see table right) are for Planning Year 0, Implementation Years 1-3 and Extension Year 5. The timeline (see page 2) shows when applications will be open and when all applications and budget proposals will be due. The intentions of this application process are to assess a schools readiness to become a community school, which is a 'new way of doing school'.

The **Planning Year 0** Grant total is up to \$50,000 for planning. This funding will be used to build relationships and collaboration and collect schoolwide and community wide data. In this planning year, schools will have a full-time CS Coordinator and opportunities for family, community and student engagement initiatives to build a site-based leadership team. A full, comprehensive Community School Strategic Plan will be created in year 0.


ALL GRANT FUNDING SUBJECT TO CHANGE BASED ON NM STATE LEGISLATION



The Implementation Grant total is up to \$150,000 for 3 consecutive years (Years 1-3) and demonstrates readiness for data-driven implementation and shared decision making. In these implementation years, CS will have a full-time CS Coordinator and opportunities to implement the CS Strategy in the 6 Key Practices. Schools interested in the Implementation Grant submit a full application. Schools already awarded an implementation grant (years 2-3) submit a budget proposal and CS Strategic Plan.

The **Extension Grant** total is determined by PED for 1 year (Year 5) for schools in advanced stages of CS implementation. This year is intended to continue data-driven and continuous improvement, establishment of financial and systemic sustainability, and preparation for possible above-the-line funding by participation in a pilot program. Funding can be used for partial (up to 75% FTE) CS Coordinator position, CS professional development, and pipeline service providers. Schools submit a form with required artifacts and information.
