#### **General Guidance**

The Healthy, Hunger-Free Kids Act of 2010 provides an alternative method in order to qualifystudents for the National School Lunch and School Breakfast Programs. The intent of the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) is to improve access to free school meals in eligible highpoverty Local Educational Agencies (SFAs) and schools and to eliminate the administrative burden of collecting household applications.

SFAs and schools participating in the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) must serve both National School Lunch Program (NSLP) and School Breakfast Program (SBP) meals to all participating children at no charge for up to four consecutive years. SFAs (District Wide), Schools or School Groupings must have an Identified Student Percentage (ISP) of at SFA at 25% to participate in CEP.

The Identified Students are students certified for free meals through means other than individual household applications; this primarily includes students who are directly certified for free meals on the basis of their participation in the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF), and the Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations (FDPIR). It also includes homeless, runaway, HeadStart, Even Start, and migrant youth. It does not include students who are categorically eligible based on submission of a free and reduced-price application (e.g., applications with a SNAP application number).

The SFA must inform the Public Education Department (PED) Student Success and Wellness Bureau (SSWB) by completing NMPED CEP Guidelines Packet (detailed below) of their notice to elect CEP for the upcoming school year by the recommended deadline of May 31, 2024 but no later than June 30, 2024.

#### **NMPED CEP Guidelines Packet:**

- MPED CEP Guidelines (this packet), signed completely and correctly;
- ISP Data for CEP for SY25-28 excel file, completed correctly and completely;

SFAs electing to participate for SY25-28 CEP are required to use the ISP data provided by PED SSWB in the ISP Data for CEP for SY25-28 excel file.

- The ISP Data for CEP for SY25-28 excel file is provided by PED SSWB and compiles the required parameters for CEP:
  - March 2024 Snapshot Data, (this reports data as of April 1, 2024 at 12:01am, per USDA regulations, [42 U.S.C. 1759a(a)(1)(F)(x)(III)]) and includes the required additions/changes submitted by the SFA's to the SSWB Data Coordinator, as submitted by April 15, 2024 per USDA regulations, [42 U.S.C. 1759a(a)(1)(F)(x)(III)].
  - State Agency's requirement to publish by May 1, 2024 the District and School-level ISP percentages per USDA regulations, [42 U.S.C. 1759a(a)(1)(F)(x)(II)] as provided to the Southwest Regional office of the USDA FNS.

While participating in CEP, the SFA or school participating in CEP must comply with the following during the CEP four year cycle:

- On a yearly basis, notify the public, School Food Authorities' Website Notice or Media Release for Free Meals Notification to Public of Free Meals for Community Eligibility Provision, as to the availability of school meals at no charge.
- On a yearly basis, provide notifications to households, as to the availability of school meals at no charge.
- Eliminate distribution of Free and Reduced Applications to households.
- Count meals at the point of service (or approved alternate) and enter in claim meal counts accurately and correctly.

A completed and signed 1) NMPED CEP Guidelines; 2) *ISP Data for CEP for SY24-27* excel file; must be returned to NMPED SSWB Data Coordinator (<a href="mailto:kate.ullrich2@ped.nm.gov">kate.ullrich2@ped.nm.gov</a>) by the recommended deadline of May 31, 2024, but no later than June 30, 2024. Please cc your assigned Health Educator.

The School Food Authority (SFA) assures the Public Education Department (PED) SSWB, the SFA has reviewed the federal regulation National School Lunch Program and School Breakfast Program: Eliminating Applications through Community Eligibility as required by the Healthy, Hunger-Free Kids Act of 2010 and will uniformly implement the following policy in fulfilling its responsibilities. The SFA certifies that each of the schools listed meets the USDA requirements for participation in CEP.

#### **Requirements:**

SFAs, schools and/or school groupings must meet a minimum level (25%) of identified students per snapshot data as of April 1, 2024 as provided by SSWB via excel file *ISP Data for CEP for SY25-28*.

Any changes to the *ISP Data for CEP for SY25-28* excel file must be submitted, completely and correctly (*including all required supporting documentation*) as detailed in the SSWB Guidance: "*Procedures for SFAs - DC Changes to ISP Percentages Checklist due April 15*" by April 15, 2024 to the PED SSWB Data Coordinator, <a href="kate.ullrich@ped.nm.gov">kate.ullrich@ped.nm.gov</a>. (SSWB Guidance can be found in Google Drive, linked above). *Please cc your assigned Health Educator*.

Eliminate the distribution and collection of Free and Reduced Applications from households in participating CEP schools.

Offer reimbursable breakfast and lunches at no charge to all students, regardless of the children's eligibility status.

Notify the public and households of the availability of school meals at no charge on a yearly basis.

SFA's are *not* to conduct eligibility verification efforts for those schools participating in the CEP.

During the CEP four-year cycle: The opening of a new school, change of district, school-level attendance boundaries, regrouping of schools, or any change to the grade structure of an existing school requires the SFA to reestablish CEP for affected schools. The SFA is required to complete the NMPED CEP Guidelines Packet by the recommended deadline of May 31, 2024, but no later than June 30, 2024.

#### Recordkeeping:

The School District shall maintain records for the entire period that the school operates under CEP **plus** five federal fiscal years, or longer if there are audit findings, and until resolution of the findings, as per 7 CFR Secs. 210.15(b), 220.7(e), 245.9(g) and 1 CCR 2254-R-8.00.

#### Required records include:

- Countersigned NMPED CEP Guidelines SY25-28
- o If applicable, supporting source documentation for student eligibility status changes submitted on April 15.
- Total daily meal counts of reimbursable meals by meal type
- Daily edit check and on-site review documentation

#### **Renewal or Extension:**

At the end of this four-year cycle (*June 30, 2028*), the SFAs should contact the PED SSWB and notify the PED SSWB whether it wishes to revert to standard meal counting and claiming procedures, Provision 2 status or begin another four-year cycle of CEP (*by completing the NMPED CEP Guidelines Packet*). Regardless of the option chosen, the SFA should inform PED in writing of the planned activity at the end of this CEP cycle by **May 31, 2028**, but must inform PED no later than **June 30, 2028**.

#### Reestablishing CEP Mid-Cycle:

Prior to the end of this four-year cycle (*June 30, 2028*), SFAs can voluntarily elect to reestablish CEP groupings and/or CEP percentages. Per USDA SP 54-2016 if a site listed in *ISP Data for CEP for SY25-28* is removed from operation in the NSLP Annual Application prior to the end of this four-year cycle, the SFA must reestablish CEP grouping percentages for the impacted grouping composition. Regardless if reestablishing CEP is voluntary or compulsory, the SFA must notify the PED SSWB by completing and submitting that applicable school year's *NMPED CEP Guidelines Packet* and *ISP Data for CEP*, by the recommended deadline of May 31, but no later than June 30 (prior to the start of the impacted school year).

#### **NMPED Guidelines:**

Submit to the PED SSWB the signed and completed NMPED Guidelines indicating which schools will participate in CEP. CEP provides the option of participating by individual school sites, a group of schools or the entire school district. The completed NM PED Guidelines CEP Packet should be submitted by the recommended deadline of May 31, 2024, but no later than June 30, 2024.

#### **CEP School and ISP List Instructions**

- The completed NMPED CEP Guidelines Packet should be submitted by May 31, 2024, to allow for editing and revisions.
  Historically, only 1% of SFAs submit their packet completely and correctly on the first attempt. SFAs should maintain
  proper time management skills and submit the completed packet by May 31, 2024 to ensure adequate time for revisions
  in order to meet the final deadline of June 30, 2024.
- The Identified Student Percentage (ISP) is calculated and multiplied by a factor of 1.6 to arrive at the free claiming percentage.
- Groupings may include one school up to all schools in the District.
  - There is no maximum amount of schools per grouping.
  - The minimum number is one school per grouping.
- The District may establish as many groupings as needed, there is no maximum amount of groupings.
- The District may determine the grouping composition, as needed.
- The CEP data uses the March 2024 Snapshot data, as this covers April 1, 2024 data, per USDA regulations.
- Districts must use the excel file ISP Data for CEP for SY25-28 to establish groupings and percentages, and can be found on the Google Drive, linked here: https://drive.google.com/drive/folders/1rfvuxrJaNrpet2En5Y2heQTiaMvkYaIr?usp=sharing
  - Please save the excel file with the name of the school district in the name.
  - Please email the completed ISP Data for CEP for SY25-28 excel spreadsheet AND the completed NMPED CEP Guidelines by the recommended deadline of May 31, 2024, but no later than June 30, 2024.
    - Submissions failing to include the required excel file (ISP Data for CEP for SY25-28), incomplete signatures, or incomplete submissions will not be accepted.
  - O Districts *must use* the excel file: *ISP Data for CEP for SY25-28* to submit ISP Lists and percentages. (Handwritten documents, word documents, pdf's of DC reports, will not be accepted).

The completed NMPED CEP Guidelines packet is due to the Public Education Department, Student Success and Wellness Bureau by the recommended deadline of May 31, 2024, but no later than June 30, 2024.
