"Secretary" means the secretary of education for the New Mexico public education department. "Teacher Leaders Network and Advisory Committee" means a committee of licensed Level II E.or III teachers, currently employed by a school district or charter school who advises the department on improving public education. Teachers are selected by an application process developed by the department. "Teacher liaison" means an employee of the department who has worked as a classroom teacher implementing and managing teacher leader development as outlined in 6.65.4 NMAC. The committee shall: meet a minimum of seven times per year; be comprised of members who serve a maximum of two years; (2)(3)begin each school year with 25 teachers, at a minimum, and 50 teachers, at a maximum; (4) recommend solutions to improve student outcomes; (5)participate in professional learning opportunities determined by the department; (6)collaborate with the secretary, or a designee on key education policy areas and programs (7) receive a stipend for members contingent upon availability of funds and (8)reflect the diverse geography and cultures of New Mexico.
