~~6.65.4.7~~ — ~~DEFINITIONS:~~

~~A.~~ — ~~“Department policymakers”~~ means any senior level department officials who have a direct impact on policy development or policy implementation.

~~B.~~ — ~~“Regionally diverse”~~ means representative of every region across the state of New Mexico.

~~C.~~ — ~~“School liaison”~~ means a Level I or II licensed teacher, employed by a local school district or charter school, not to include school administration, who serves as their school’s representative to facilitate communication between the school and the department.

~~D.~~ — ~~“Secretary”~~ means the secretary of education for the New Mexico public education department.

~~E.~~ — ~~“Teacher Leaders Network and Advisory Committee”~~ means a committee of licensed Level II or III teachers, currently employed by a school district or charter school who advises the department on improving public education. Teachers are selected by an application process developed by the department.

**~~F.~~ — ~~“Teacher liaison”~~ means an employee of the department who has worked as a classroom teacher implementing and managing teacher leader development as outlined in 6.65.4 NMAC.

~~6.65.4.8~~ — ~~REQUIREMENTS FOR TEACHER LEADERS NETWORK & ADVISORY COMMITTEE:~~

~~A.~~ — ~~Teacher Leaders Network and Advisory Committee.~~ The committee shall:

- ~~(1)~~ — meet a minimum of seven times per year;
- ~~(2)~~ — be comprised of members who serve a maximum of two years;
- ~~(3)~~ — begin each school year with 25 teachers, at a minimum, and 50 teachers, at a maximum;
- ~~(4)~~ — recommend solutions to improve student outcomes;
- ~~(5)~~ — participate in professional learning opportunities determined by the department;
- ~~(6)~~ — collaborate with the secretary, or a designee on key education policy areas and programs
- ~~(7)~~ — receive a stipend for members contingent upon availability of funds and
- ~~(8)~~ — reflect the diverse geography and cultures of New Mexico.

- ~~_____ (4) _____ share announcements with each of the two teacher leader groups outlined in this rule;~~
