



SAT® School Day, administered by College Board, measures academic proficiency in mathematics and language arts. All grade 11 students in New Mexico public schools are expected to participate in the spring SAT School Day, except for students with significant cognitive disabilities who take the alternate assessment based upon an IEP.



When is the test given?

SAT School Day assessments are administered in the spring, between March 17 – April 25, 2025.



What does the test measure?

In participating in SAT School Day, students will show their mastery of New Mexico English Language Arts and Mathematics Standards. Information on NM Standards alignment for SAT School Day is available [here](#).

How is the test administered?

SAT School Day is administered as a computer-based, multistage adaptive exam, composed of two sections: Reading and Writing (ERW), and Math.

Students have 64 minutes to complete the Reading and Writing section and 70 minutes to complete the Math section. Total testing time is 2 hours and 14 minutes.

Both the Reading and Writing section and Math section are divided into two equal-length and separately timed parts, called modules. The first module contains a mix of easy, medium, and hard questions. Based on how a student performs on the first module, the second module of questions will either be more difficult or less difficult.

Test scores range from 400-1600 for the mathematics and reading/writing sections combined.
