**School response**: Amy Biehl HS considers it vital to use the bulk of its revenues to support all students.

ABHS consistently spent between 74% and 77% of its operating funds on instruction and student support services (that includes three full-time social workers). The school is mindful of administration costs and has been working to reduce them (note a 2% reduction in the last two reported years, FY22 and FY23). Additionally, the school must pay the Building Manager's salary along with utilities and these costs represent the operations/plant maintenance 9-10% of expenses


