Class Size

Class Load Limits in Elementary School

- Research shows that student and staff outcomes improve with smaller class sizes. This strategy is particularly effective for elementary and atrisk students.
- Concerns have been raised about how a change in class size limits would be effective given the current number of teachers and available classrooms, and the cost to provide for both.
- A staggered approach provides a solution, with implementation that includes a phased in approach for elementary schools. For example, one grade level per year over six years.

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Insurance

In March, the New Mexico Public School Insurance Authority announced anticipated premium increases of:

• 31.86 percent for risk coverage and 15.53 percent for medical benefits.

In May, the Public Education Department (PED), Department of Finance and Administration, New Mexico Public School Insurance Authority, and Legislative Finance Committee, collaborated to pass an amended rate increase of:

• 14.99 percent for risk and 10 percent for health benefits.

The risk increase will go into effect July 2024.

The medical increase will go into effect October 2024.

State Equalization Guarantee – Unit Value

The State Equalization Guarantee (SEG), otherwise known as the funding formula, is the amount of money the State of New Mexico guarantees to provide to a district to cover the costs of specific programs. The PED administers the SEG and determines the initial and final unit values each year as a method of distribution.

School Year	Initial Unit Value	Final Unit Value	Percent Change from Previous Year
2022-2023	\$5,450.92	\$5,522.50	13.6%
2023-2024	\$6,241.67	\$6,241.67	13.0%
2024-2025	\$6,553.75*	The final unit value will be set by January 31, 2025.	5.0%

* The initially proposed unit value for the 2024-2025 school year was \$6,442.55, which would have been a 3.2 percent increase from the previous year.
