School response: South Valley Prep ensures public funds entrusted to the school are used for their specific intent. The school prioritizes student academic performance as the driving force when developing the school's budget. Funding to support health and wellbeing of students is also made

available and is often cited by community members during its annual budget survey that is administered to families, alumni, current and former governing council members, current and former school staff/administrators, community partners, etc. in early spring (see most recent survey <u>here</u>).

South Valley Prep plans for long-term stability by building on its cash balance (e.g., right-sizing efforts during FY2025 by reducing and non-instructional and administrative costs). This is done in anticipation of fluctuations in revenue sometimes experienced from one year to the next. The school's success is predicated on focusing expenditures where it is most needed (i.e., the classroom) and where it has been most effective.
