The funding will be distributed as subgrants from the Charter School Program (CSP) grant, awarded to PCSNM by the U.S. Department of Education in 2023.

Two established schools, Solare Collegiate Charter School in southwest Albuquerque and East Mountain High School in Sandia Park, will each receive \$1.5 million to support their expansion, and two new schools, Sacramento School of Engineering and Science (SSES) in Alamogordo and Equip Academy of New Mexico in Albuquerque, will each receive \$2 million to help launch their innovative programs.

"This school will not only challenge students to reach their full potential, but also equip them with workforce-ready skills in high-demand STEM careers."

Equip Academy of New Mexico will offer a dynamic learning experience for kindergarten through 5th grade students with a focus on blending high academic standards and culturally responsive teaching. "At Equip Academy, our vision is to empower every child with the tools to unlock their full potential," said Mercy Herrera, Founder. "We are committed to equipping students with the knowledge and skills they need to dream boldly, engage meaningfully, and pursue lives filled with purpose."
