**School response:** The operational expenditure report below highlights most of its operational expenses are spent in the classroom. Not only are teachers paid from the direct instruction function but the instructional materials, curriculum and supplies are also purchased for student use and success. While the student support category may show a low spending percentage, the school was awarded state and federal funds to help supplement this support. This function has increased over the years due to the special ed population increasing. Our administration costs consist of a Director, Business Manager, and Administrative Assistant which help the school stay compliant and run smoothly. The maintenance and operations function of the schools' expenses consist of the building lease, utilities, and maintenance costs to keep the school clean and safe for students. There was a drop in expenses in function 1000 in FY24 due to the school receiving a \$1 million Outdoor Experiential Education grant that was used to help the outdoor classroom learning experience.

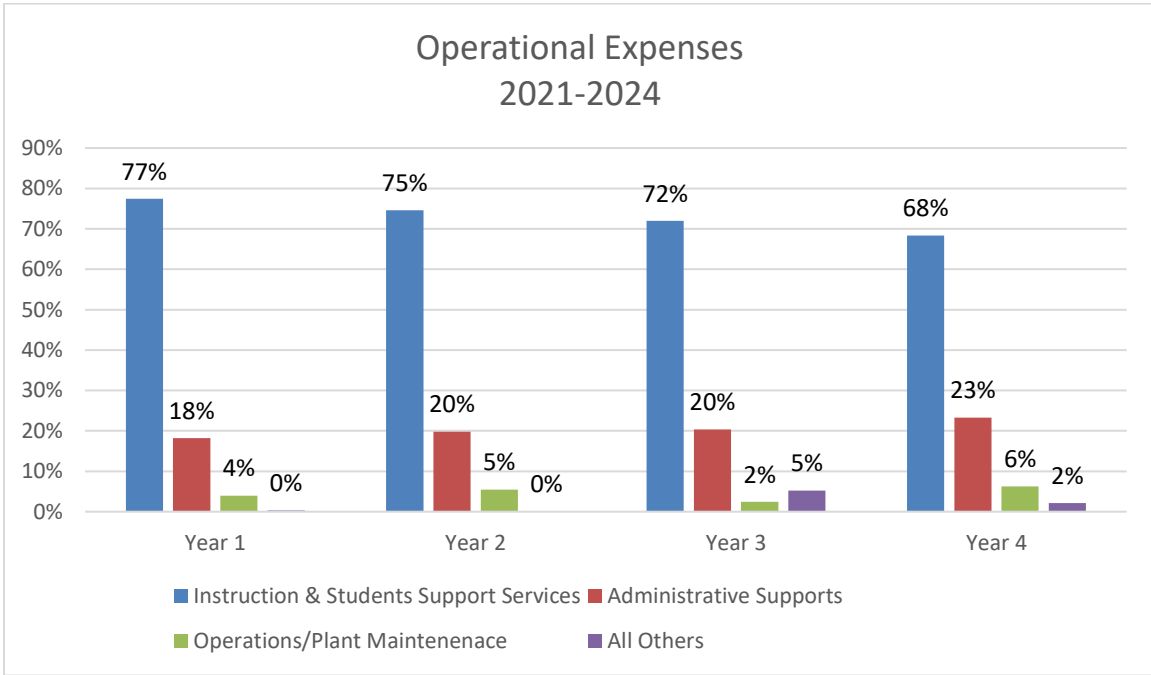

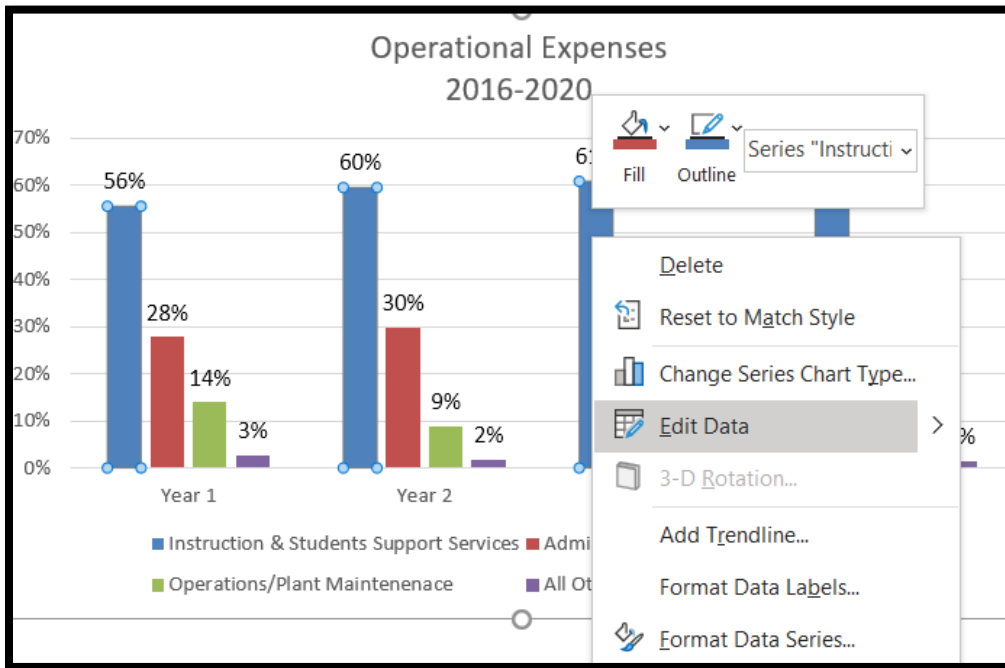
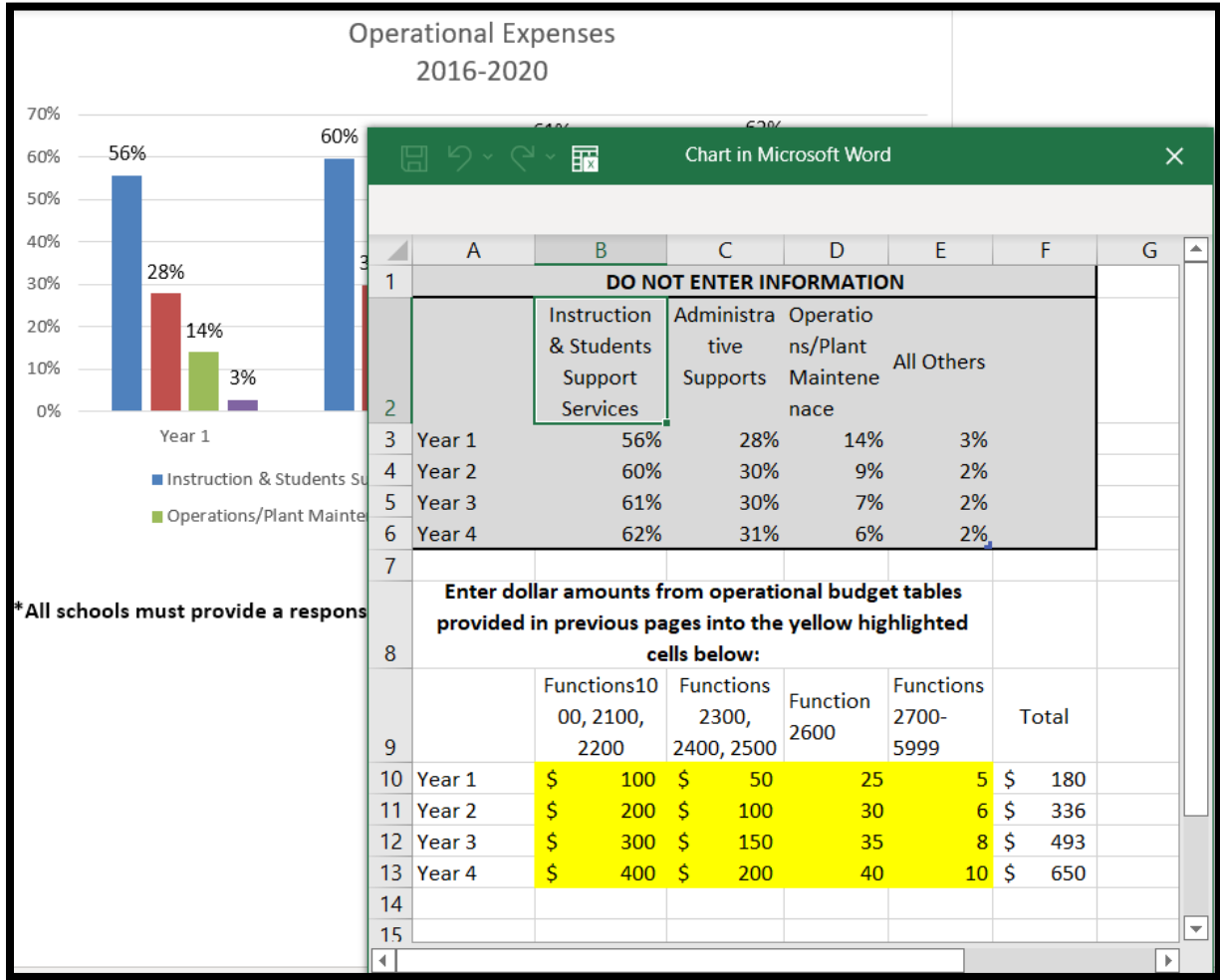




Table that appears when “Edit Data” is selected:
