



Barriers to School Attendance

Illness

Household challenges (housing or food insecurity, lacking other basic needs)

Disengagement (feeling disconnected, lack of motivation, lack of interest)

Mental health

Transportation


Other (exhaustion from staying up late playing video games, browsing social media, etc.)

\$5M Attendance Improvement Appropriation


Provided the following support:



Attendance Conference



Path Forward: To Do More We Need More

More funding allows for:

- Expanding support for focused interventions and evidence-based practices.
- Increasing support for vulnerable student populations.
- Improving behavioral health and socialemotional learning (SEL) supports.
- Enhancing connectedness and belonging efforts.
- Increasing family engagement and awareness.
- Improving data-sharing capabilities.



Recommendations



Create a dedicated statewide team of five attendance coordinators

This would allow for more hands-on support by region (Northwest, Northeast, Central, Southwest, Southeast).



Enhanced school and district-level information systems to move towards real-time data access



Support the creation and funding of Campus Attendance Interventionist positions
