Presidential Awards for Excellence in Math and Science Teaching

The Presidential Awards for Excellence in Mathematics and

<u>Science Teaching (PAEMST)</u> is the highest recognition that a kindergarten through 12th-grade mathematics or science teacher may receive for outstanding teaching in the U.S. Awardees receive a citation signed by the POTUS, a trip for two to Washington, D.C., to attend a series of recognition events and professional development opportunities, and a \$10,000 award from the National Science Foundation. Anyone—principals, teachers, parents, students, or members of the general public—may nominate a teacher starting on October 1, 2024. Applications are due 9:59 p.m. MST (11:59 p.m. EST) on Thursday, Feb. 6, 2025.

Not only does the program provide a scholarship, but also vital support services such as mentors, financial literacy skills, college success coaches and more.
