DEFINING EQUITY NOW

- It evolves based on social, political, and educational landscapes
- Equity requires ongoing reassessment to adapt to changes and shifting needs

WHO WE SERVE

- The Martinez/Yazzie lawsuit identified student groups that have not been fully supported in education.
- Equity Councils help ensure these students receive the support they need while also working to create better opportunities for all students.
- Despite challenges, we must stay focused on this work by adapting, collaborating, and finding new ways to support students effectively.

OUR ROLE: STAYING COMMITTED IN CHANGING TIMES

- Equity work requires consistency, even when circumstances shift.
- Listening to students, families, and educators helps us understand real needs.
- Collaboration strengthens our ability to adapt and make a lasting impact.
- Our work is about action—identifying barriers, finding solutions, and advocating for meaningful change

EQUITY IN ACTION: BEYOND WORDS, CREATING REAL CHANGE

- Equity is not a checklist—it's a mindset, a practice, and a commitment.
- What we do in classrooms, schools, and districts directly shapes student experiences.
- Authentic equity work means breaking down barriers, not just identifying them.
- If students don't feel seen, heard, and valued, then the work is not done.

STAYING GROUNDED: STRENGTHENING OUR COMMITMENT TO EQUITY

- Equity work is ongoing—it requires patience, resilience, and reflection.
- Challenges will arise, but we must stay focused on students and their success.
- To sustain this work, we must balance urgency with long-term commitment.
- Grounding ourselves means leaning on one another, learning continuously, and remembering our purpose.
