

New Mexico Public Education Commission (PEC)

Governing Body Member Change Notification Instructions

Purpose: To notify the Public Education Commission (PEC) of a change in a member or members of the school's Governing Body. The school may report multiple member resignations/removals and designations on the same form.

Submission Deadline: Changes to the Governing Body membership do not require prior approval of the PEC; however, notice must be received within 30 calendar days of the change. Vacancies must be filled within 45 days; one 30-day extension may be requested.

Notifications completed 14 days prior to the next PEC meeting will be placed on the next agenda. Notifications of this type are typically placed on the consent agenda; however, any notification may be removed from the consent agenda and moved to the regular agenda for full discussion and possible action by the PEC.

Meeting minutes of the governing board of the school and the PEC will serve as an amendment to, or compliance with, the charter contract regarding this membership change. The documentation will be added to the board of finance documentation on file with CSD.

VI. Principal Report

Current enrollment 751 plus 20 pre k, down 10 from 40th day. 57% native, 77% minority and over 200 on wait list. Received today annual report findings from charter division for 2023-24 year. Attendance and retention did not meet requirements- said we did not submit proper paperwork. Juliane sent them evidence that proper paperwork was submitted on time. Licensure discrepancies as well as accounting principles, resubmitted evidence to prove otherwise specifically involving a staff member that was no longer working at the school. CSP grant will be reapplied for- 4th or 5th time we are trying. Overview of school drug policy based on King's questions regarding consequences following infractions. High school has around 10 kids with reports of vaping at school, policy is a no drug school allowed on campus. Consequences range from out of school suspension, in school suspension, counseling sessions for 1st offense- will also depend on if it is tobacco or marijuana. If dealing or on 2nd offense, go to disciplinary hearing- usually in the past these students have left school to avoid expulsion. King questioning if consequences are substantial enough- suggested idea of community service-based opportunities to see result of drug use. Question of how often drug offenses are occurring. Handful of kids caught twice, more have been caught once. Culture of kids not reporting what they see, want to avoid being a "snitch". Came up today with plan of interventions to monitor the bathrooms better. Recently, 2 female athletes physically attacked another student- entire high school student body was assembled and discussed with kids what type of culture they want to create at school and the importance of informing admin if they hear or see anything. Vape detectors are a possibilityexpensive but could be a possibility. 3 times this semester have tried calling sheriff's office to have drug dogs come in to check school- have not found any drugs from previous attempts. Will keep trying.

VII. Finance Report

Increase revenue for 6 additional kids for SEG. Bond funds and transportation funds will be coming in in the next few months but still need to limit spending. Cash flow for November and December not great due to funding not coming in much during these months. Impact aid have funding but have not received money yet. Majority of funds will be spent by the end of the year. Transportation fully spent today. On



track to spend all down. Did pay off buses and working on bond items. Hoping to get bond in February. USDA money didn't come in till October. Voided check from October was reissued.
