

Designing Effective Professional Development

•Sustained: PD should be ongoing, allowing educators time to reflect, apply, and refine their learning.

•Intensive: Focus on deep, high-quality professional learning experiences to foster real change.

•Collaborative: PD should promote teamwork, peer learning, and shared problemsolving to enhance collective expertise.

•Job-Embedded: PD must be integrated into daily teaching practices, ensuring that it is directly relevant to educators' needs in the classroom.

•Data-Driven: Use data to inform and evaluate PD efforts, ensuring continuous improvement and alignment with student outcomes.

Aligning PD with School and LEA Plans

- Ensure PD aligns with **school goals** and **LEA strategic plans** to maximize its relevance and effectiveness.
- Use data and needs assessments to guide PD activities, targeting areas where teachers need support most.
- Focus PD on enhancing **educator effectiveness**, ensuring that learning is applicable to real classroom challenges.
- Link PD efforts to **student achievement goals**, ensuring that professional growth translates into improved student outcomes.

What is ERIC? (https://eric.ed.gov/)

Educational Resources Information Center (ERIC)

ERIC:

- Is a valuable resource for accessing educational literature and research.
- Allows you to explore a wide range of peer-reviewed articles and studies related to professional development.

Navigating ERIC

When using ERIC it is

• essential to employ effective search strategies to find relevant resources.

• look for peer-reviewed articles and evaluate their credibility

What is WWC? (https://ies.ed.gov/ncee/wwc/)

What Works Clearinghouse (WWC)

WWC:

- Is another essential tool for researching evidence-based programs.
- Provides reviews and ratings of educational interventions,
- Helps identify programs that have demonstrated positive outcomes.

Navigating WWC

Using WWC:

- Allows you to interpret WWC reviews and understanding the evidence standards
- Assists in making informed decisions when selecting professional development programs.
- Gives you ratings to guide your choices and select programs with proven effectiveness.
