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Highlights: CTE Leadership Workshop and NMACTE Conference


From January 13 to 15, the College and Career Readiness Bureau hosted our annual CTE Leadership Workshop in Albuquerque. The event attracted over 250 in-person participants and more than 50 online attendees, successfully bringing together CTE leaders from across the state. Participants networked, collaborated, learned best practices, prepared for the upcoming round of CTE funding applications, and engaged in various other whole-group and breakout sessions.

A few highlights from the event included discussions on the new Career Clusters Framework and an engaging introduction to Universal Design for Learning (UDL) presented by Amanda Bastoni, the Director of Career Technical & Adult Education at CAST Inc. Michael Brustein, Esq., from the Bruman Group, provided updates on EDGAR federal regulations. Bill Daggett, Ed. D., from the Successful Practices Network and the International Center for Leadership in Education, delivered an eye-opening keynote session on how to keep CTE courses relevant amidst rapid advancements in technology. Additionally, there were breakout sessions led by the CCRB team that covered various topics, including CTE applications, work-based learning, next step plans, and much more.

Following the workshop, the CCRB team attended the New Mexico Association for Career Technical Education (NMACTE) conference alongside many New Mexico CTE teachers and leaders. The two-day event began with a fun and engaging opening session led by Dr. Shannon Norris Parish, Assistant Professor of Agricultural Communications at NMSU. A variety of fascinating breakout sessions followed, led by secondary and postsecondary educators and experts from the CTE field from throughout the state and beyond. NMACTE division meetings were also held, and several new division leaders were elected.



Friday concluded on a high note with the NMACTE Business Meeting and Awards Luncheon, where new board members were announced and several awards were presented. CCRB Director Breezy Gutierrez received the NMACTE Administrator of the Year award for her ongoing dedication to advocating for and supporting CTE students, educators, and leaders across the state.

The conference proved to be an enriching and insightful experience for everyone involved,

fostering lively discussions and providing valuable knowledge that deepened participants' understanding of high-quality CTE. The CCRB is proud to collaborate with NMACTE to promote and support highquality career and technical education for all through



STEP-UP: Short-Term Research Experience Program to Unlock Potential

STEP-UP supports high school juniors and seniors from groups historically excluded from science to spend a summer in a paid, full-time internship at research labs near their homes. The program aims to allow underresourced and underrepresented high school students to explore and contribute to the scientific community.

This research opportunity is intended to last approximately eight weeks and generally runs from the first week in June until the first week of August. A stipend is provided for the students after completion of the 8-week program. Travel costs for the students will be covered to present their research at the annual End-of-Summer STEP-UP Research Symposium, where they can showcase their work in Bethesda, Maryland.
