College and Career Readiness Bureau Contracts Advance CTE for the Creation of Graduate Profiles

The College and Career Readiness Bureau of the New Mexico Public Education Department is pleased to announce that Advance CTE has been selected to provide state-level services to facilitate the creation and publication of graduate profiles.

A graduate profile (sometimes referred to as *profile of a graduate* or *portrait of a graduate*) is a visualization of what a community believes their high school graduates need to know and demonstrate before they leave school. An LEA co-creates their graduate profile with input from key community partners and uses the document to communicate the attitudes, skills, and knowledge that are needed and valued for success in college, career, and life.

In the 2024 legislative session, New Mexico passed House Bill 171, requiring all LEAs to create a unique graduate profile that articulates the core academic competencies and subjects that are key to graduates' post-high school success. Additionally, students' next-step plans must be aligned with the district or charter school's graduate profile.

Advance CTE is the longest-standing national non-profit that represents state directors of career technical education (CTE). Advance CTE provides professional development, advocates high-quality CTE policies, programs, and pathways, and equips leaders with knowledge, tools, and inspiration to move CTE forward.

"New Mexico's initiative to develop graduate profiles and statewide support for their adoption presents an exciting opportunity to ensure all learners graduate high school prepared for college, career, and life," said Nithya Govindasamy, Senior Director of Policy at Advance CTE. "Advance CTE is thrilled to partner with the New Mexico Public Education Department, bringing our national expertise and insights in high-quality education frameworks to help connect communities and create clear, flexible, and meaningful pathways for learners to thrive. We look forward to engaging all actors involved in learner success to provide input and help reimagine what success looks like."

Five NM Candidates Named for the U.S. Presidential Scholars Program in Career and Technical Education

The U.S. Presidential Scholars Program was established in 1964, by executive order of the President, to recognize and honor some of our nation's most distinguished graduating high school seniors. In 1979, the program was extended to recognize students who demonstrate exceptional talent in the visual, creative, and performing arts. In 2015, the program was again extended to recognize students who demonstrate ability and accomplishment in career and technical education fields. Each year, up to 161 students are named Presidential Scholars, one of the nation's highest honors for high school students.

In April, the <u>Commission on Presidential Scholars</u> reviews the applications of all semifinalists and selects up to 161 U.S Presidential Scholars each year. All scholars are honored for their accomplishments during the online National Recognition Program.

U.S Presidential Scholars are awarded the U.S. Presidential Scholars medallion each June.

CTE Application Opens

 Opening of the 2025-2026 CTE Application for Perkins/federal and NextGen/state funding. The application will be opened by your CTE coach upon successful completion of your APR.

April 4, 2025

Deadline to commit with a substantially in-progress application

 If your CTE application and budgets are not substantially inprogress by April 4, 2025, your LEA/HEI will **not** be eligible for Perkins/NextGen funding for 2024-2025.

March - May 2025

Technical assistance for applications and budgets

- CTE coaches will provide technical assistance on CTE applications and budgets in GMS. Once "Substantial Approval" is provided by the CTE coach, LEAs can then enter the Perkins/NextGen budgets into OBMS.
- The NMPED School Budget Bureau will provide the FY26 Operating Budget deadlines in late March or early April. That timeline dictates when OBMS will open for each LEA/HEI.

June 6, 2025

Deadline to submit budgets

 Deadline to submit budgets in OBMS, in order to ensure full budget authority on July 1, 2025.
