Unified Application Overview



The Unified Application

The Unified Application (UA) is a consolidated application for federal plans that allows LEAs to focus on strategically using funds to support student learning.

The Unified Application will:

- Provide a single platform for LEAs to complete applications for federal funds;
- Align those applications on a single timeline;
- Consolidate common requirements across federal programs (e.g. equitable services and needs assessments); and
- Automate data entry and calculations to ensure accuracy and compliance with federal requirements.

By reducing administrative burden with a consolidated application, LEAs will have more time to dedicate to planning and implementation.

Unified Application Structure

The Unified Application includes three modules: Priorities, Compliance, and Expenditure Detail. Once submitted by the LEA and approved by NMPED, the Unified Application will represent the LEA's federally required plan to meet compliance and spending requirements.

The **Priorities** module collects information about LEA choices related to strategic priorities (e.g. High Quality Instructional Materials).

The **Compliance** module collects key information required for federal grants administration. There are two separate modules for ESEA and IDEA compliance.

The **Expenditure Detail** module collects planned expenditures by federal funding source.

Key UA Milestones

The Unified Application will launch in three stages: the Pre-Application module, ESEA, and IDEA. The Unified Application is due Wednesday, April 16th.

There are two types of roles that can access the UA in OBMS:

LEA Grant Manager - One person per LEA. This is the superintendent or the superintendent's designee and the person responsible for signing the applications assurances and for submitting the UA to NMPED for review. The LEA Grant Manager assigns LEA Editors.

LEA Grant Editor - The LEA Grant Manager can assign as many LEA Grant Editors as necessary. At the LEA's discretion, one or many editors can complete submodules within the UA.

UA Allocations



Planning Awards in the Unified Application

The federal appropriations process sets funding levels for programs. The U.S. Department of Education has not yet provided preliminary allocations for federal fiscal year (FFY) 2025 awards that start on July 1.

Title I-A planning awards are based on the proportional share of an LEA's award from the last verified final allocations. For FY 25-26, planning awards are based on FY 24-25 final allocations.

- Current planning allocations are based on approximately 90% of the total final allocation amount.
- U.S. Census data (email dated February 11, 2025) affects eligibility; poverty rate for NM declined slightly.

Title IV-A planning awards account for the \$10,000 minimum allocation.

- LEAs with final 24-25 awards *equal to or greater than* \$11,115 will receive planning awards that are 90% of the total final allocation amount.
- LEAs with final 24-25 awards *less than* \$11,115 will receive a 25-26 planning award of \$10,000. LEAs that receive the minimum planning award amount should keep in mind that the final 25-26 award is not likely to change.

Allocations Snapshot

The OBMS grants management system populates allocations in the UA. The UA automatically adjusts access to and versions of submodules based on allocation amounts.

Transferability / Alternate Fund Use Authority (AFUA)



Transferability / Alternative Fund Use Authority Overview

The UA has a Transferability/AFUA submodule for LEAs to opt into ESEA fund-use flexibilities. Using these flexibilities will have implications for the OBMS Legacy Budget as well as RfRs.

Flexibility	Description
Transferability	Any LEA can transfer up to 100% of the funds received under Title II-A and Title IV-A to certain existing ESEA allocations, including Title I-A, Title I-C, Title I-D, Title II-A, Title III, Title IV-A, and Title V RLIS. Transferred funds become funds of the program to which they are transferred and subject to the rules and requirements applicable of the receiving fund(s).
Alternative Fund Use Authority (AFUA)	AFUA provides LEAs eligible for the Small, Rural School Achievement Program (SRSA) broad authority to spend Title II-A and Title IV-A funds on activities carried out in one or more of the following programs: Title I-A, Title II-A, Title III-A, Title IV-A, Title IV-B. Title II and Title IV-A funds that use AFUA are exempt from some spending requirements of those programs.

Business Manager Considerations:

- OBMS Legacy Budget - UCOA codes for Title II and Title IV-A will be unrestricted to account for fund uses across applicable ESEA grants.
- LEAs that use transferability must track transferred funds outside of OBMS grants management and indicate the use of transferred funds on RfRs, when applicable.

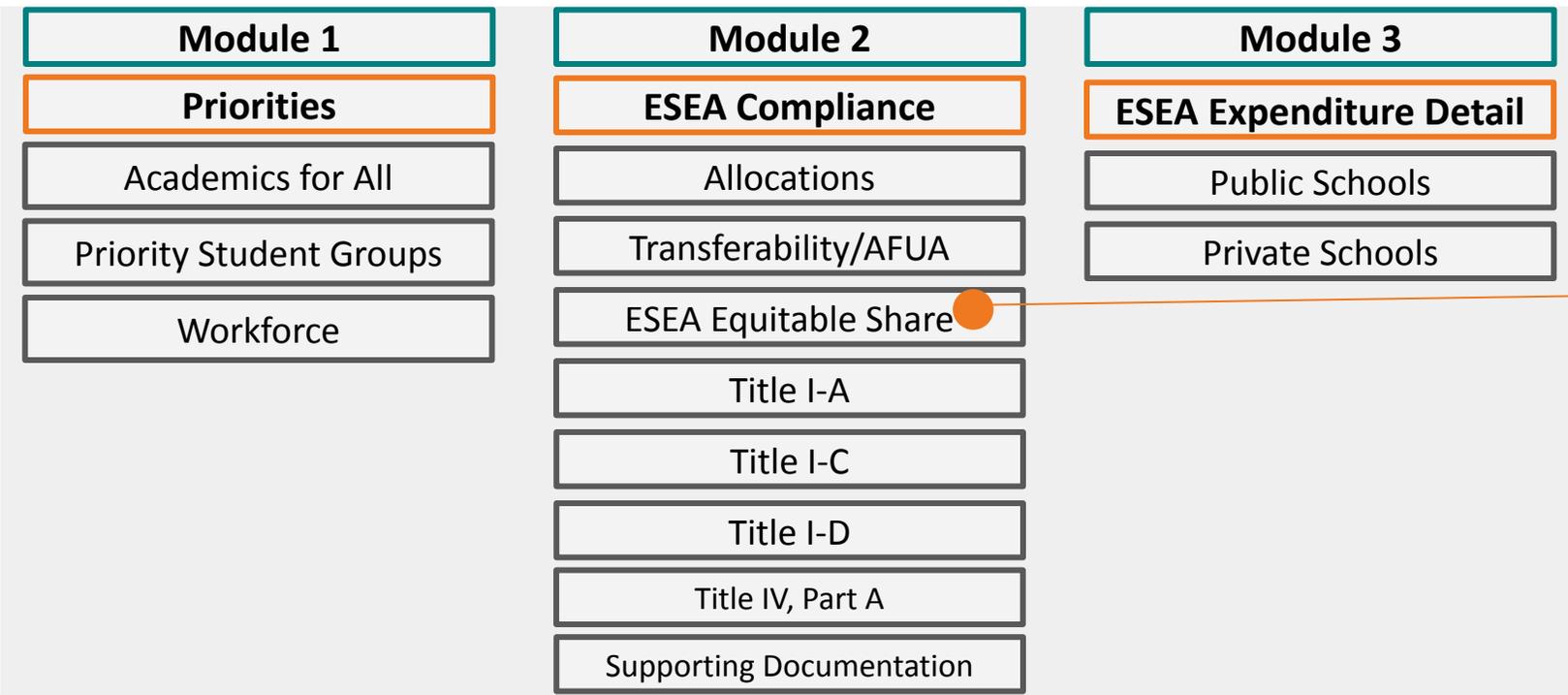

- Changes to direct and indirect administrative cost reservations can impact public and private school proportionate shares. Business managers and federal programs directors should coordinate accordingly.
- LEAs must track equitable share carryover funds separately

Title I, Part A School Allocations



Title I-A School Allocations

Title I, Part A is unique among the ESEA grant allocations because LEAs must allocate Title I-A funds at the school level. LEAs with more than 1,000 students must conduct an allocation process call “rank and serve.” The results of this process are provided at Step 3 of the Title I-A submodule.

- In the Expenditure Detail module, all Title I-A school level expenditures will use a “SCH” grants management (GM) code.

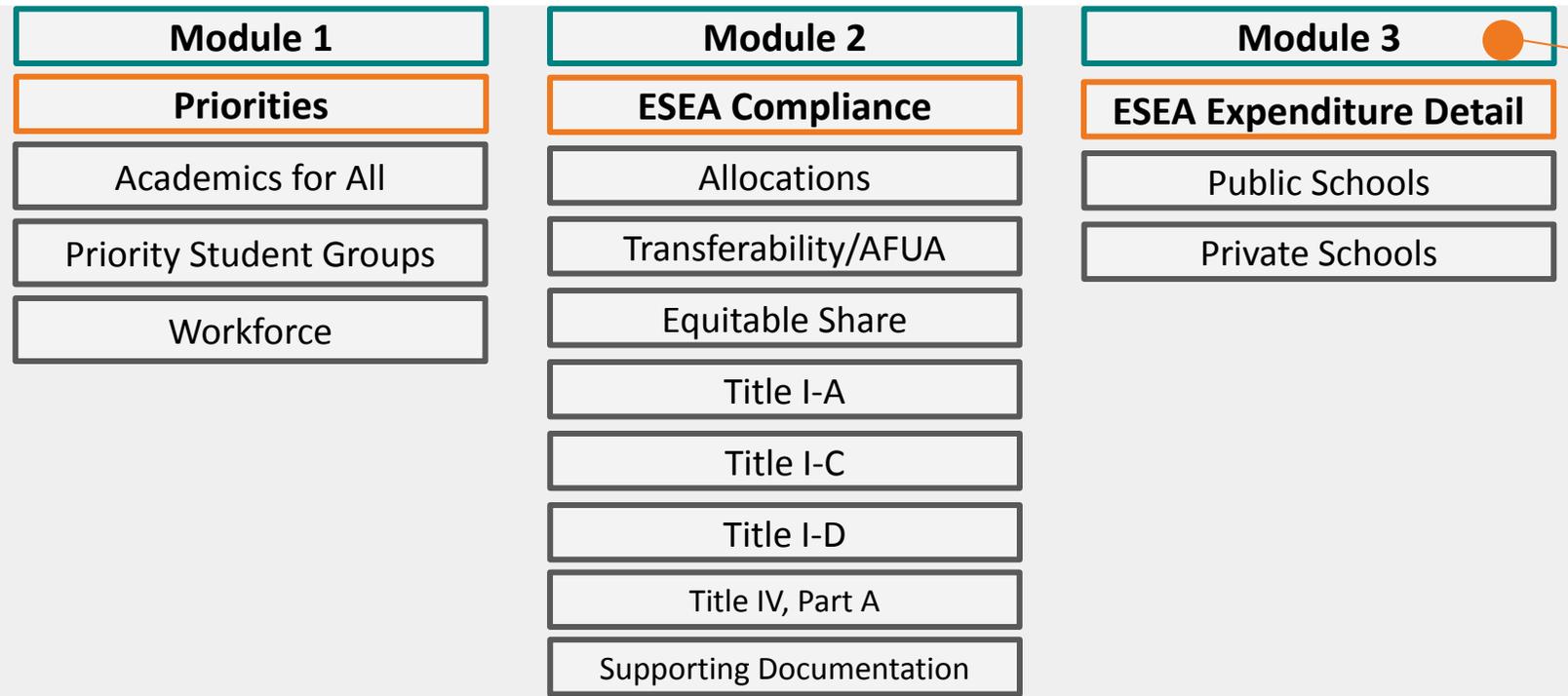
Expenditure Detail Overview



Expenditure Detail Module

The Expenditure Detail is the third module in the Unified Application. The Expenditure Detail module connects spending with the decisions the LEA made in the Priorities and Compliance modules. For LEAs that are responsible for equitable services, there are separate Expenditure Details for public and private school expenses.

Structure of the UA



All LEAs will need to complete the Expenditure Detail module.

Expenditure Detail Purpose and Process

In the ESEA Expenditure Detail module, LEAs will detail how they will spend ESEA funds at the *expenditure* level. This is a shift from ESEA Sharepoint applications, which focused on spending at the *activity* level.

Module Purpose:

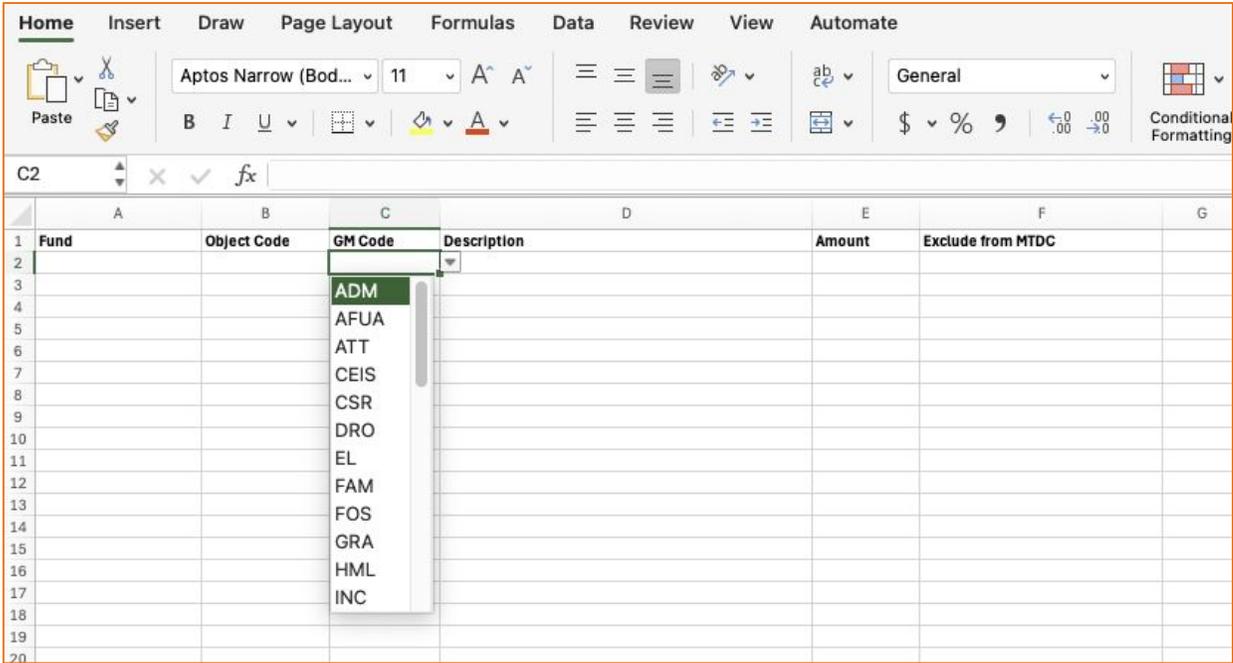
- Aligns grant spending with the LEA's priorities and compliance decisions.
- Provides the detail necessary for NMPED to determine that planned expenditures meet grant requirements and federal cost principles.
- Replaces pre-approval forms for equipment over \$5,000.

Module Completion Process:

- An LEA's federal programs team will complete the Expenditure Detail module in consultation with the LEA's UA planning team.

Optional: Expenditure Detail Upload/Download

LEAs have the option to upload an initial set of expenditures using the Expenditure Detail Template Spreadsheet (coming to the Unified Application Support Page this week). This is a tool for LEAs that already have existing budgets and/or wish to create the expenditure detail offline.



Upload

LEAs do not have to complete all fields of the template to successfully upload the expenditure data.

LEAs should only upload expenditure data to start the Expenditure Detail module. Uploaded data will replace any existing expenditure data.

Download

After the LEA has completed the Expenditure Detail module, the LEA may download a .csv file of the Expenditure Detail module.

If the LEA completes an ESEA Private School Expenditure Detail, the LEA will download it as a separate file.

Fund - the grant which is funding the expenditure

Object - the type of service or commodity purchased; the UA uses parent object codes only

Grants Management (GM) code - optional; ties expenditure to specific grant requirement

Description - information that supports the allowability of the expenditure

Amount - direct cost of item

Exclude from MTDC - check for equipment, capital expenditures, charges for patient care, rental costs, tuition remission, scholarships and fellowships, participant support costs, and the portion of each subaward in excess of \$25,000

Grants Management Codes

The UA uses Grants Management (GM) codes to connect spending and grant compliance. LEAs will use GM codes to tag expenditures to required reservations and to indicate allowability and flexibilities. Most, but not all, expenditures will have GM codes.

GM Codes

GM codes are a tool used by federal program directors to indicate grant spending is compliance with federal requirements.

GM codes are specific to federal grant programs and track three types of grant compliance in the UA:

- Required reservations
- Allowability
- ESEA flexibilities

Each ESEA fund has a custom configuration of GM codes tailored to federal program requirements.

UCoA

UCoA allows business managers and NMPED's state finance bureau to report education expenditures in accordance with [financial data requirements by the National Center for Education Statistics \(NCES\)](#).

UCoA is a national set of standards and guidance that applies to all education-related expenditures and is not grant program-specific.

UCoA provides a method to report education expenditures comprehensively and uniformly.

Modified Total Direct Costs

Modified Total Direct Costs (MTDC) means all direct salaries and wages, applicable fringe benefits, materials and supplies, services, travel, and up to the first \$25,000 of each subaward. LEAs may recover indirect costs based on the MTDC.

MTDC excludes the following costs:

- Equipment,
- Capital expenditures,
- Charges for patient care and tuition remission,
- Rental costs,
- Scholarships, and
- Fellowships, as well as
- The portion of each subgrant/subcontract in excess of \$25,000.

LEAs should check “Exclude from MTDC” if any of these costs apply. For subgrants/subcontracts with object code 53000, the UA will automatically exclude any amount above \$25,000.

Generally, ADM costs will be in the Public School Expenditure Detail, with the exception of Title-A direct admin for private schools, which will be in the Private School Expenditure Detail.

The IDC calculator calculates the maximum IDC that an LEA can reserve based on the Modified Total Direct Cost (MTDC) from the expenditure detail.

LEAs can reserve any amount of IDC up to the maximum shown in the calculator.

The total IDC reserved for each fund will show in the ESEA Expenditure Detail Dashboard. For LEAs that are responsible for equitable services, the IDC amounts in the Expenditure Detail module must match the amounts in the ESEA Equitable Services submodule.
